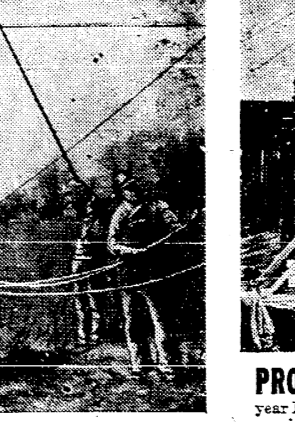

Our Leningrad trip comes to a climax with a big dinner given in Eric's honor by Popkov, whose title I suppose was Mayor of Leningrad. Anyway, he is head of the local Soviet, and more important still, he is for this region Stalin's right hand in the organization of the Communist Party, second only to Zdanov. 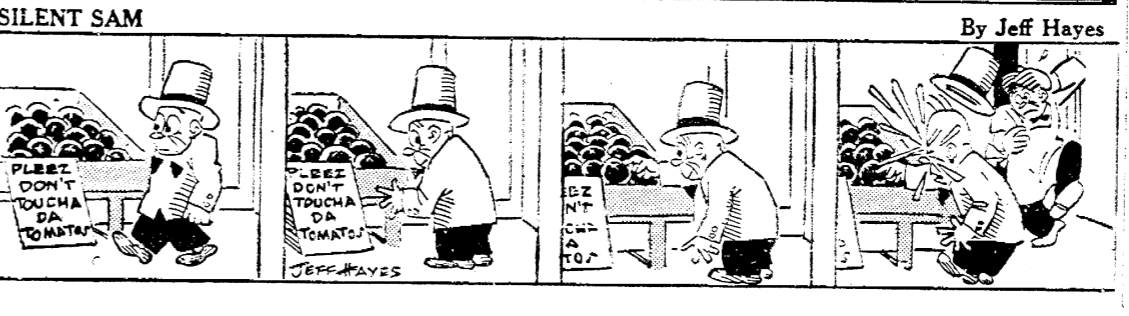
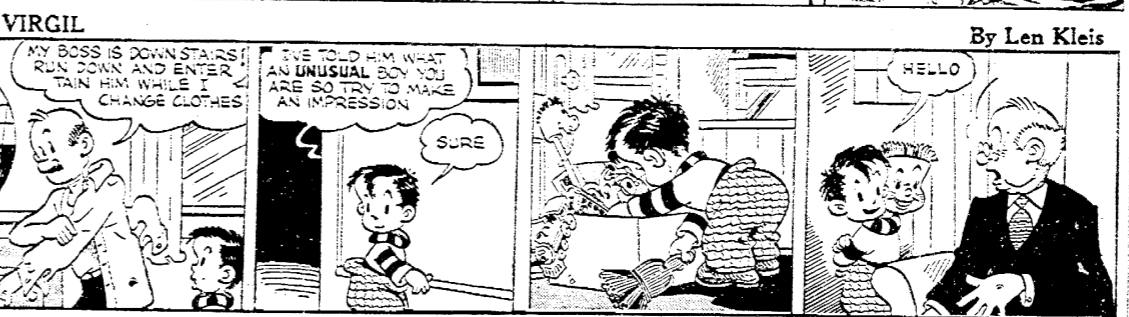
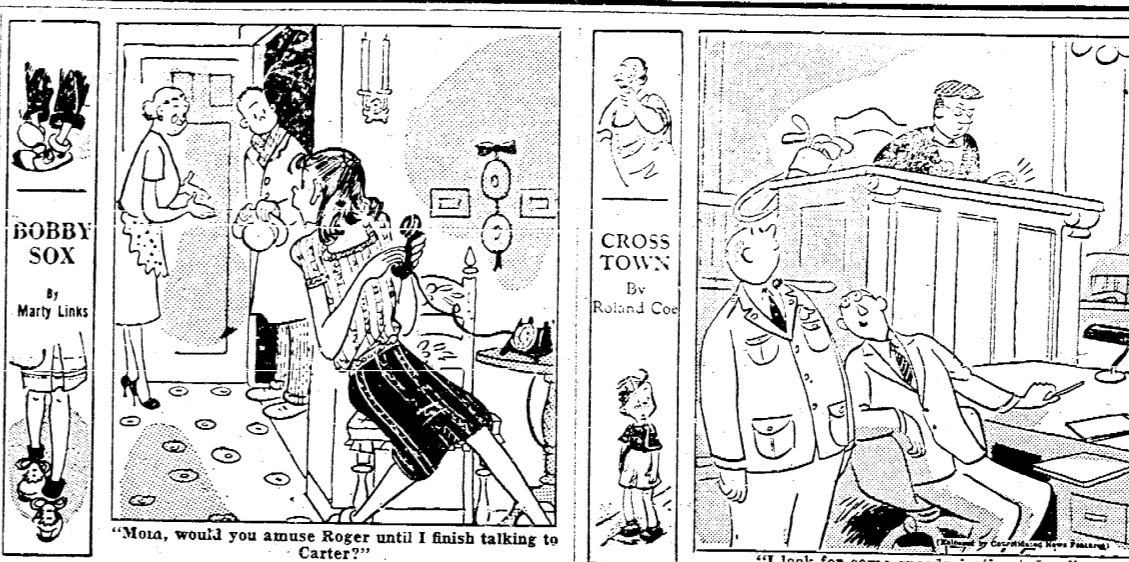
