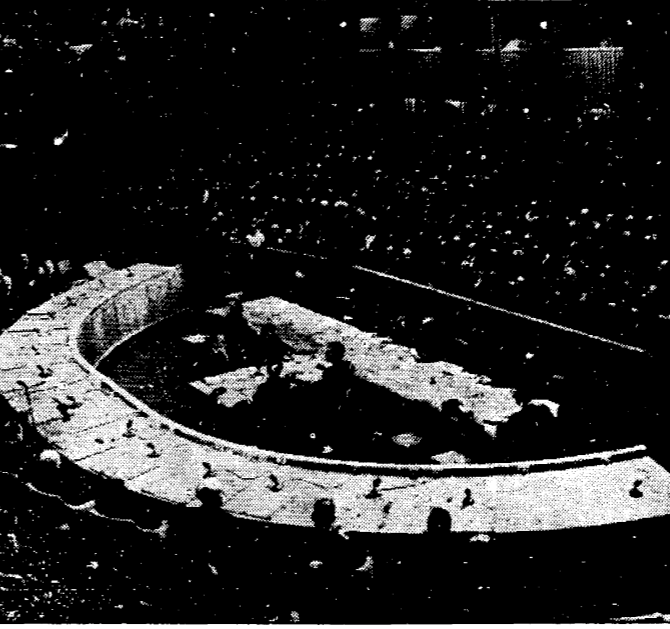

For each 100 of population, there are more college and university students from the small cities, towns and farms than from the larger cities. Rural America supplies the greater portion of the brains of the country.
