
## AMENDMENT NO. 2 THOMAS MARTIN MARRIES MILDRED REID FRIDAY STILL UNDER FIRE







Whatever the total of that inven-

tory, representing the total wealth of the nation, the government would issue money enough to cover all of the amount. That money was to be divided equally among all the people of the nation, men, women and children, on a per capita basis.




