Serve Leftovers With an Eye to Color

Glamorizing Leftovers "Wouldn't it be wonderful if we never had to bother with leftovers," I heard a homemaker say recently. Well, lettovers need not be
the PROBLEM
which many
women regard
them, for they

them, for they can really be made interesting. As a matter of fact, many of my friends welcome dinners made with leftevers because they take so little

time to prepare. Mever let the leftover problem get out of hand is my first bit of advice, however, for then food will spoil and will have to be thrown out. Plan in advance what will be leftover and include it in the menu. This is easy to do with roasts and even vegetables.






