Bell Telephone Company Asks Rate Increases

Michigan Bell Telephone Company profits last year dropped 38 per cent below the 1946 figure despite the highest revenues in the company's history.

That was the story unfolded today by Thomas N. Lacy, president, in the company's annual report that revealed a return of only 1.8 cents on each dollar invested in the business. By contrast, he said, the return had risen from 6 cents in the opening three months to three cents in the final quarter.

The company collected \$97,000,000 from its customers in 1947, an increase of 6 per cent over gross revenues for the preceding year. Its expenses climbed 13 per cent

to \$107,776,000. As a result, earnings were \$10,224,000 in 1947, down from \$13,230,000 in 1946 to last year's \$7,722,000.

A dividend of \$3 a share was declared on the \$27,000,000 of 1946-47 profits.

Looking ahead, Lacy said, the company expects "to supply a continuously improving service to the public, to provide a reasonable return to those whose savings are invested in the business, and to furnish good jobs for thousands of people with plenty of opportunity for advancement in a growing business."

Michigan Bell added 513 circuits to its long distance network and more than double the home "walk" population of 10 years ago.

Michigan Bell had 65,000 orders on the waiting list at the beginning of 1947, most of which could be filled only by custom-made switches, boards and cable additions. The company also received 124,000 new applications for service in 1947. All the end of the year, the waiting list had risen to 115,000.

Lacy said that during the last quarter, the company every week was installing more than 8,000 telephone lines, and adding more than \$1,000,000 worth of equipment to its system.

The company reported an average of 7,811,000 local calls a day, an increase of 10 per cent over 1946, and 21,300 long distance calls daily, including 34,000 to other states.

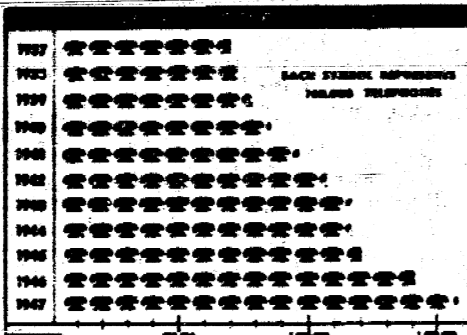
Clean, parasite and disease-free early pasture can be provided by sowing new seedlings or alfalfa or clover seedlings by using small areas of rye, wheat, alfalfa, or June grass not pastured by swine the previous year. Young litters with their mothers should be put on pasture as early as possible to prevent anemia and other baby pig ailments.

The use of temporary 3-inch high fence makes possible adjustment of areas to needs. A suitable shelter should be provided for the sow and litter.

Heavy fall growth of wheat or rye also furnishes good early pasture for ewes and their young lambs. Limited or controlled grazing of suitable areas also makes harvesting of a crop possible.

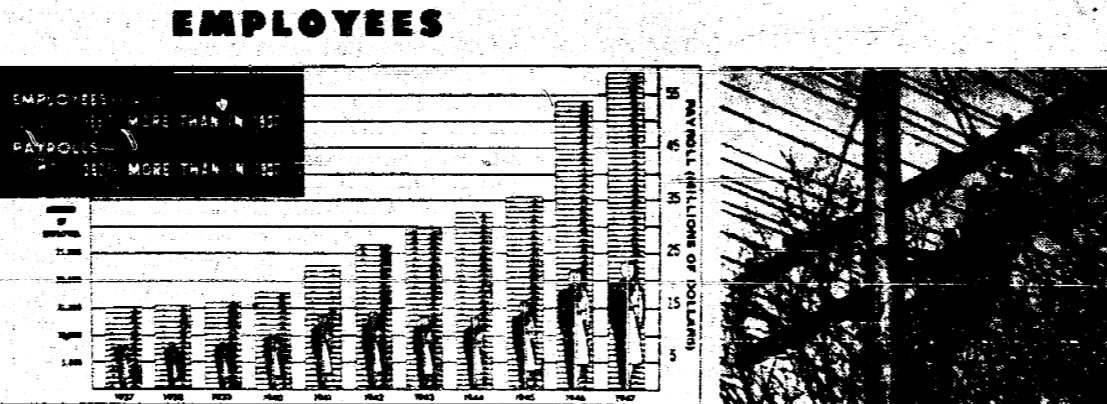

Money received from customers for service was 6% more than in 1946. But costs of providing service—wages, taxes, goods and services from others, etc.—rose 12%. Earnings per investor's dollar dropped to about half of what they were in the previous year.
