



A LL of us cannot be expert seamstresses without some practice,
and we must all take the first few
steps in sewing carefully. Of course,
there are lots of aids, and even an
amsteur can turn to professional,
practically, in fust a few lessons.

If you have seved little or none
at all, select only simple, straight
line patterns without too much intricate detail. There is no sense in
tecking a job too hard because it
will only discourage you.

The choice of fabric is another
important point for the beginner to
bear in mind. The type of construction, rather than the kind of fiber,
determines the easy handling of a
fabric.
