





ANSWER: I would not advise using black asphaltum for this purpose. Your wallpaper may be pulpy and absorbent, and probably the plaster also absorbe sud moiss much of the dampness from the air. Before repapering, and after removing the present paper, try the effect of painting the walls with good aluminum paint. QUESTION: There is a "ring" in the ceiling where some patching had been done. Will this correct itself if the ceiling is repapered after a lapse of several months? after a lapse of several months?

ANSWER: It is possible that the plaster may have disintegrated from excessive dampness or isakage, and the discoloration should be examined by a plasterer and taken care of before paper is busq. When the patching was done, it may be that not enough plaster was cut out, and a damaged area still remains.




