Good Care Will Bring Returns From Muck Soil

Michigan's muck soil area—estimated at one acre in every eight—is one of the most fertile in the state. However, it is so fertile that it is often neglected. Good care will bring returns from muck soil.

Lower grain prices will mean more profitable livestock production for Michigan farmers. Farm price supports, too, will continue to make the picture a good one for the farmer.

Of course there are a few things which tend to make the picture a little less bright. Marketing costs which are still going up. The fact that there is a smaller share of the consumer's dollar. Highway Toll Hits New Peak In September

The highest monthly traffic toll in Michigan was registered in September, when 148 persons were killed, according to the monthly statistical report of the Michigan State Police.

The September toll was 11 more than during the same month last year and an increase of eight over the previous monthly high of a year of 137, the record during Aug.

In addition, there were 3,543 persons injured and 10,728 accidents. These figures were almost exactly the same as for September of 1947.

Twelve children ranging from 5 to 14 years of age—some of them pedestrians and three bicyclists—were among those killed. This was the fewest in September of 1947 and the reduction is partly attributed to a statewide child safety campaign program carried out during the month.

The record for the first nine months of this year shows 298 persons killed, 29,122 injured and 100,650 accidents. Compared with the same period last year, deaths decreased 27 or three percent, injuries increased 1,840 or seven percent and reported accidents increased 3,572 or four percent.

Seven counties, Benzie, Leelanau, Mackinac, Montcalm, Newaygo, Oscoda and Otsego reported no deaths, 34 showed an increase, 38 a decrease and 11 had the same number.

Mileage for the first eight months of this year showed an increase of eight percent over the same period last year, but the death rate of 74 per 100 million miles of travel was down 10 percent.

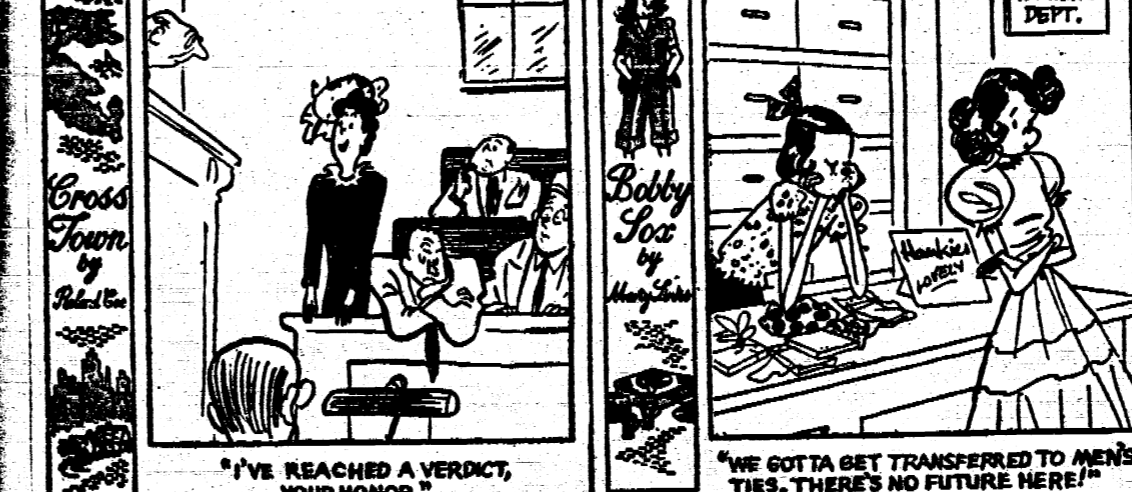

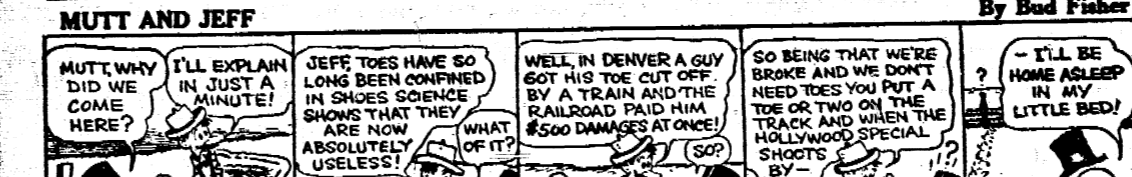

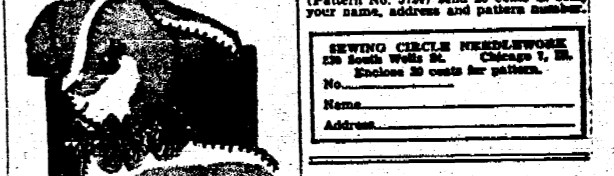
