RESULTS of the recent election, as this column has pointed out in previous editions, marks the end of an era and the beginning of a new period in economics, in labor relations and in the capitalist or so-called free enterprise system.

Since March, 1934, when Franklin D. Roosevelt entered the White House, the nation has gone through a period of social and economic reforms, long overdue, and considered by a majority of the people as essential for the liberty and pursuit of happiness of the masses of Americans. These reforms were called the New Deal.

A program of social reform represented by the so-called vetoed interests of big business has returned to accept, or at least to acquiesce in, the measures which have been largely in violation by the National Association of Manufacturers and is considered by such men as Sen. Robert A. Taft of Ohio, has fought with every fiber of his being against the reforms, but with every fiber of his being he has failed to prevent the enactment of these New Deal reforms.

The use of money and huge industrial and economic power in the by-elections of 1934 showed that the government in Washington for big business, but not quite the government for the masses and most everyone except Harry H. Truman and the plain everyday American people believed they would complete the job last November 2.

But they failed and the plain people won. So it is refreshing to read in the current issue of *Home Reporter* the editorial "The Road to Nowhere," which tells us that the industrial machines what this reporter believes is some sound and sane advice to American industry and that segment of society which historically backed the Republican party.

For years industry has been pouring hundreds of millions of dollars down a rathole in a belief that, if the man in the street can understand industry properly he will support it staunchly. The cold truth is that the average citizen has been more than willing to support the free enterprise system that has in the ability of some of the nation's best industrial machines what this reporter believes is some sound and sane advice to American industry and that segment of society which historically backed the Republican party.

Whether the sound and wise advice given in this industrial magazine will be heeded by big business cannot be foretold. It will be remembered that Eric Johnston, former president of the United States chamber of commerce, gave much the same sound advice in mid-1934 to his fellow industrialists. Mr. Johnston, now heading up the Motion Picture Association of America, warned that "the whole process of thinking of capitalism for the privileged few must be raised to a plane where responsibility to the public interest is the key word."

He warned that capitalism must change so that "man is more important than the machine or the products of the machine... where the primary and dignity of man come first." Mr. Johnston was prophetic when he said, "We must turn from the old monopolistic competition which involved competition of the little fellow to the new competition which provides a way for thinking, for inventive mind, which holds prices reasonable, makes better living, stimulates, but never suppresses opportunity."

However, big business, representing capitalism, refused to recognize those reforms of those reforms, and the Republican leadership, which the public feels is so closely related and identified to big business, again stands discredited.

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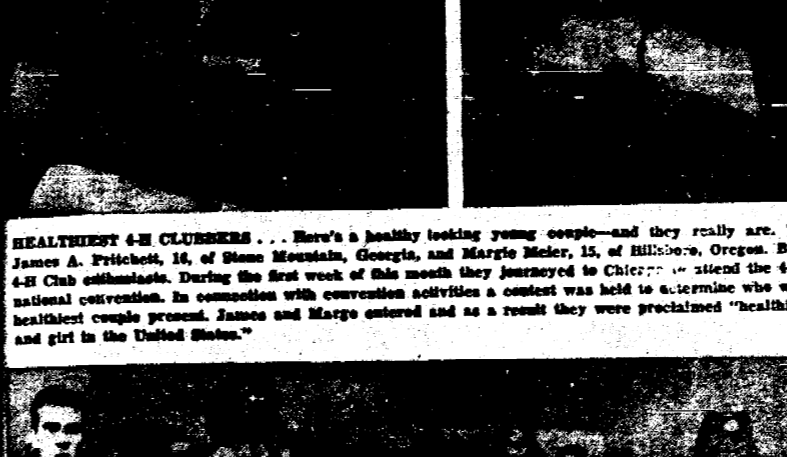

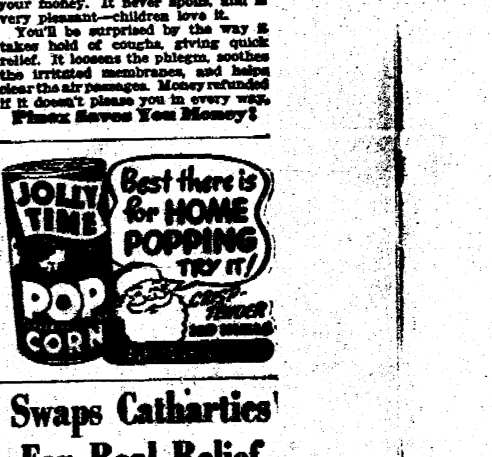

Christmas Toys For Every Need

Be a careful shopper when you select Christmas toys. Just as there are different types of toys for each age level, there are toys that serve different purposes in each age group.

Great Royal Feasts Once Marked Yule

A modern Christmas dinner is a mere "snack" compared to the royal Yule banquets of Kings and Queens in history.

For one of Edward III's Christmas feasts 1,200 oxen were prepared. The guests ate as much as they could and the east leftovers were distributed to the poor. It happened to come along, Edward was the first English king to employ French cooks for a Christmas feast.

When Henry III spent Christmas at Gloucester, he ordered the sheriff to buy 20 large oxen to put into pies for the Christmas dinner. Richard II feasted 10,000 people at a banquet in 1396. He kept more than 1,000 oxen, each of which was spiced in one kind or food.

Hang Stockings For Santa Claus

Why have stockings come to be a traditional receptacle for Christmas gifts?

Although historians can give no authentic answer, they point out that children's stockings are usually hung by the chimney to keep warm or dry out, so it was natural that Santa Claus should be regarded as the place in which to deposit gifts.

In certain regions of France it is the story that is put out on Christmas Eve. Some authorities say that shoes and stockings were put near the fireplace for the same reason that an old boot was associated with a wedding in order to bring good luck and drive away evil spirits.

Simple Holiday Decorations May Still Reflect Yule Spirit

Yule Record Begins In Fifth Century

There is no mention of a Christmas observance of December 25 in Christian records before the 5th century. There is, in fact, no record to indicate what date Jesus was born.

Various researchers have set the day as January 6, March 25, May 20, April 19 and November 17. In order to win Christmas converts away from their observance of the pagan winter festival, early Christians indicated them to observe the birth of Christ Jesus at that time instead. Thus December 25 came to be established as Christmas.

Real Santa Claus A Youthful Saint

The name of Santa Claus is more properly the Dutch Saint Nicholas, which is of course, St. Nicholas. American children are probably the only ones who say it exactly that way.

Nicholas was an actual person. He was Bishop of Myra, in Lycia, Asia Minor, in the first part of the fourth century. He was also the youngest bishop in the history of the church.

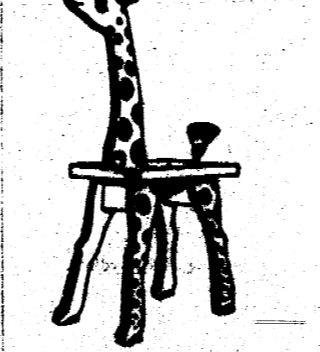
Santa's Enemies
