The people of Michigan again have declared their want of a change in the way in which the state is governed. For several years the M. E. Be Careful Over The Holidays Is Warning of Department of Health

"A careful Christmas is a cheerful Christmas," the Michigan Department of Health cautioned today.

"Don't let accident, sickness or death take your holiday," the Department warned in its annual reminder of pre-holiday and holiday health in the Department of Health, now being distributed.

One tenth of all accidental deaths in the state in 1944 occurred during Christmas. Of the 223 December fatalities from the accident, 182 occurred in the home while traffic took the lives of 41. Public Safety says other major causes of accidental death.
