HOME NURSING PAMPHLET IS NOW AVAILABLE
Every woman in a home should know the fundamentals of good home nursing care. Miss Helen Baker, Director of the Bureau of Nursing, Michigan Department of Health, and today in announcing a new pamphlet "Home Care of the Bed Patient," prepared by the Department.
Miss Baker pointed out that hospitals are crowded, that trained and practical nurses are hard to find, and often times, family budgets are inadequate to cover such care.
The new pamphlet, she said, was prepared to help the homemaker in care of the patient who is in bed, whether because of communicable disease, chronic illness or child birth. It is not technical but gives the fundamentals of making the patient comfortable and helping him to get well. In most communities of the state there are health department or visiting nurses who will assist the homemaker to carry out the procedures recommended. "Home Care of the Bed Patient" will be sent free to any person in the state who requests it from the Michigan Department of Health in Lansing.
