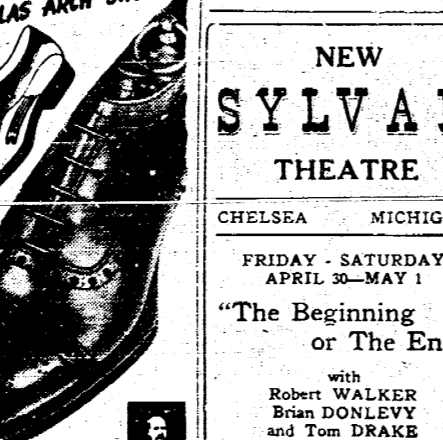

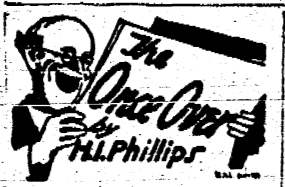
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NEW CAMPAIGN TECHNIQUES

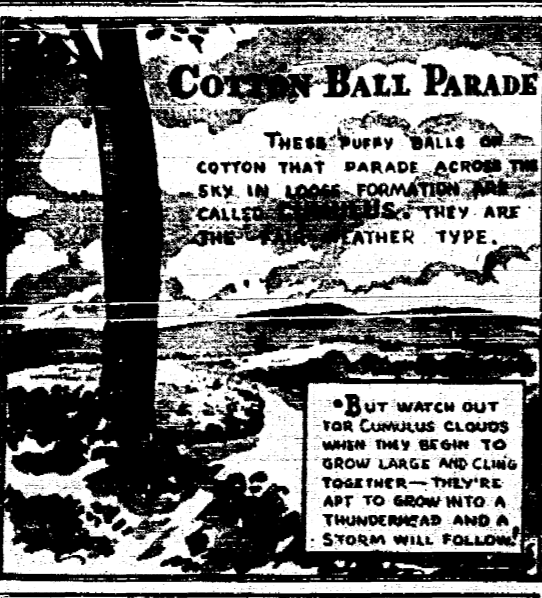

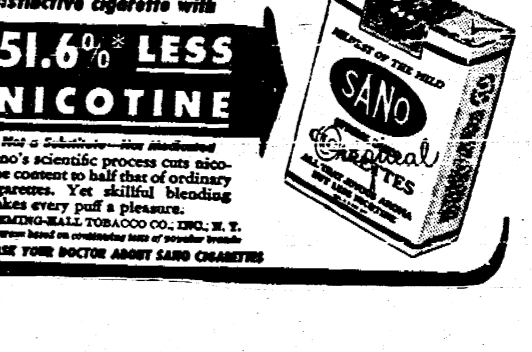

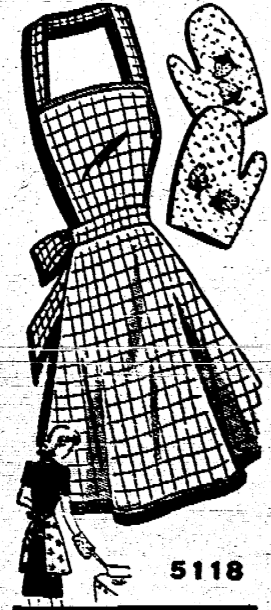

Charming Toddler's Clothing Can Be Made From Cast-Offs

Do you really think that adult's clothing can be made over into really wearable things for youngsters? There's something so pathetic about seeing a little girl in something that obviously was her mother's, said a woman to me one day.

Of course, there are misadventures and mishaps: if a woman simply cuts down her dress for daughter or Dad's trousers for son and leaves grow-up lines and creases in them, she has not done the kind of re-modeling job that I talk about.

QUESTION: We are using quite a bit of plywood in our home, and want to keep it natural—also all the woodwork. What is the best to use on it to keep it a light color? Also, what can I use to fill the nail-holes so they won't show.

ANSWER: The metal has rusted through from lack of paint. Could I paint over the metal with some of the new-type waterproof paint?

ANSWER: All plywood, except fir plywood, can be given a thin coat of white shellac thinned half-and-half with denatured alcohol. Then two thin, even coats of paste wax are applied, and, when each coat is dry, it should be well rubbed.

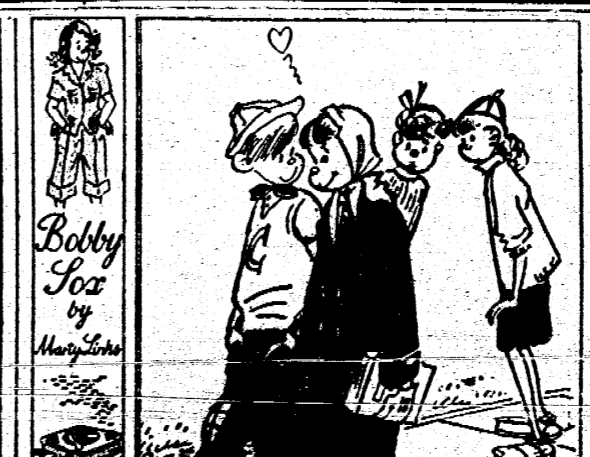
