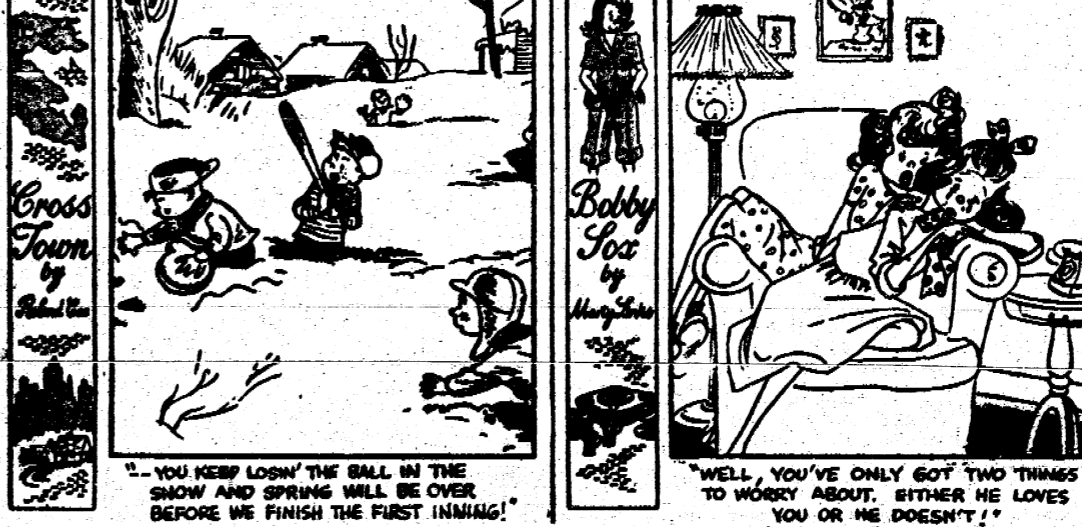

Drive Safe and Sane This Holiday Week-end

WARNING OF AUTO CLUB SAFETY DIRECTOR

DETROIT, August 31—Anticipating a surge of holiday traffic and accidents over the Labor Day week end, Automobile Club of Michigan today joined state police and other safety agencies in plea to "Take It Easy" on the state highways and city streets.

"Our record in past years for Labor Day week ends has not been an encouraging one," said Ernest P. Davis, Auto Club safety and traffic director.

"Over the week end last year 18 persons lost their lives in Michigan traffic, and countless more were injured or inconvenienced in non-fatal accidents. What's the cure in saving 10 minutes by driving 70 miles an hour and taking all kinds of chances?" Davis asked.

Highest fatal toll over Labor Day week end in recent years came in 1940 when 46 persons were killed in Michigan traffic accidents.

Davis emphasized that more cars will be on the road this week end than any time since 1941 and that most of them are not new cars.

He listed six suggestions to insure a safe and sane motor holiday:

1. Take It Easy! Don't weave in and out of traffic. Maintain a steady driving pace without excessive speed or racing spurts in traffic.
2. Don't drive on wrong side of road. Keep to right at all times.
3. Don't pass on hills, curves or at street intersections.

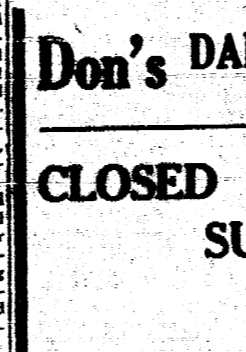
