

Silo Should Be Ready For Filling Soon

to in good condition will result in hetter keep of the silage according to agricultural engineers at MSC The silo should first be cleaned by scraping off any old sitage that may be adhering to the walls. All litter at the bottom of the silo should be taken out.

Air leaks in walls may cause silage to spoil. Walls sheald be carefully examined and small cracks filled. Melted parafin applied with a paint brush is good for this purpose. Since parafin is inflaminable when hot care should be taken when using it, it should be brushed into cracks or joints vhile it is still warm.



THE RINGS YOU CAN'T HEAR - Many imthe results. Take the matter of ringing on rural lines, for example.
