



### Western Allies Place Berlin Issue Before U.N. as Negotiations Fail; Two Unions Barred From A-Plants

#### "BLACK FURY"

There was no war in sight, yet the Berlin situation was steadily deteriorating.

It was dangerous for the United States, Great Britain, France and Russia—and for the United Nations who had to straighten their hands over the divided city of Berlin.

Practically an ultimatum was issued among U. N. delegates in Paris. There was no reason for peace.

No list of apprehensions appeared in the western nations' attitudes. They said they would react to themselves the full right to take necessary measures were necessary to maintain their position in Berlin.

After the three ambassadors, Smith of the U. S., Roberts of England and Chalmers of France, had left the Soviet capital the western allies made public a 34,000-word "white paper" charging the Russians with watching on a secret agreement by Stalin to lift the Berlin blockade.

When the western nations discovered the disconcerting fact that Russia was literally trying to pull it fast one in order to gain control of Berlin, further direct negotiation was patently useless.

MOTIVES: Russian. Washington believes the crisis centering in Berlin will continue at fever pitch at least until next spring—provided it does not explode into total war before then.

THEY WILL be able to do this, they believe, because American efforts and sentiment will be divided and weakened by the election campaign.

Official Soviet attitude is that American leaders will be so intimidated in domestic affairs that they will be able to give only a fraction of their aid.

NO ATOMS: Two Unions. At the atomic crossroads, the government has acted to bar unions whose officers refuse to take the non-Communist oath from its atom bomb plants.

These are the three western ambassadors to Russia who engaged in the series of riposte and unavailing diplomatic fencing with Soviet Foreign Minister Vyacheslav Molotov on the subject of Germany and the Berlin blockade.

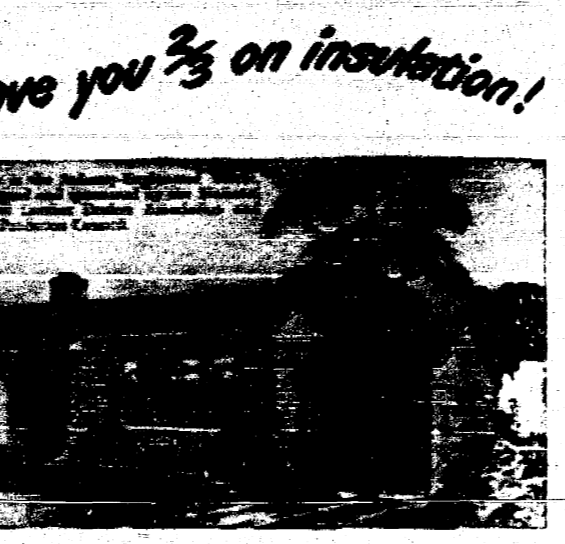

## New Farm Program Affects Farmers, Supports Prices

The new farm program, authorized by Congress, will have an effect on the support prices which are guaranteed to farmers, according to MSC farm economists.

Support prices were originally planned to encourage farmers to increase and maintain production during the war years when great quantities of food were needed. Support prices also were set for other farm products such as eggs, hogs, and turkeys. Also supported at 90 percent of parity through 1949 are such commodities as cotton, peanuts, and rice.

Price supports on most farm products are to continue at 90 percent of parity through 1949 as has been the practice in the past. For increase and maintenance of production during the war years when great quantities of food were needed, support prices also were set for other farm products such as eggs, hogs, and turkeys. Also supported at 90 percent of parity through 1949 are such commodities as cotton, peanuts, and rice.
