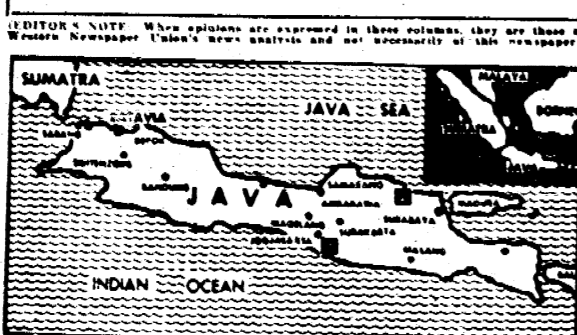

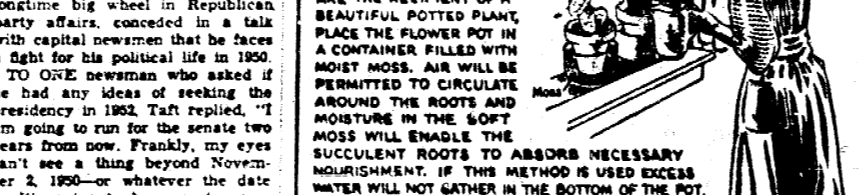

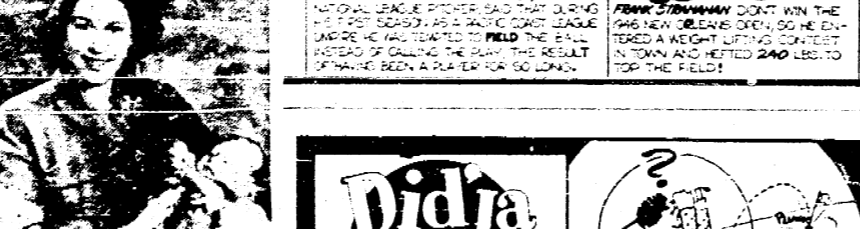

# 1948 Healthiest Year In State's History

When all the figures have been tallied, the year 1948 will be the healthiest in the state's history, Dr. Albert E. Heustis, State Health Commissioner said today.

The death rate for 1948 will be the lowest in the state's history. On the basis of the first nine months figures, the state's death rate will drop to 9.15 per 1,000 population as compared with the rate of 9.26 in 1947 and the previous low of 9.52 in 1942.

The incidence of communicable diseases will undergo several changes. The only two major causes of death will move down the list. pneumonia and tuberculosis will be at the bottom. The ten leading causes of death for the year will be heart disease, cancer, arteriosclerosis, influenza, pneumonia, diabetes, tuberculosis, measles, mumps and scarlet fever. The rate of heart disease, cancer, arteriosclerosis and influenza will be several times that of tuberculosis.

Judging from the first nine months, the year will be the healthiest in the state's history. On the basis of the first nine months figures, the state's death rate will drop to 9.15 per 1,000 population as compared with the rate of 9.26 in 1947 and the previous low of 9.52 in 1942.

**Health Services**  
January marks the 27th anniversary of one of Michigan's most effective public health services—the free distribution of biologic products for the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of disease.

Michigan was one of the first states to provide biologic products free to the physicians of the state. This was begun in 1921. Michigan had one of the highest diphtheria death rates in the nation—25 per 100,000 population. The late Dr. C. C. Young, then director of the Bureau of Laboratories of the Michigan Department of Health, told Governor Alexander J. Groves that this death rate would be cut in half in a year if the laboratories were enabled to furnish physicians free of charge, the biologic products needed to prevent and treat the disease.

### Fluid Milk Prices Decline

Decreased demand for milk on the part of condensers and dairy product manufacturers coupled with a better than anticipated production of milk during the fall months, has brought about a substantial decline in prices paid to farmers for fluid milk throughout most of the country, according to Howard F. Simmons, secretary-manager of the Michigan Milk Producers Association. In the Detroit milkshed, however, the price for Class I (fluid milk) has remained constant at \$5.34 per hundred pounds during recent months but will decline 28 cents on January 1st, bringing the farmers \$5.36 a hundred, F.O.B. Detroit.

### Phone Hearings Set For Jan. 26

LANSING, January 5.—Hearings on the application of the Michigan Bell Telephone Company for a \$20,400,000 increase in revenues will get under way January 26 before the Michigan Public Service Commission.

The commission set the hearing date promptly upon the receipt of the company's formal application for the revenue increase, which, after taxes, would mean \$12,600,000. Half the amount of the additional revenue is sought as immediate relief, amounting to a boost of 22 cents a month in rates for residential service and 30 cents a month on business telephones, along with increases in long distance rates.

Plant additions of \$33,000,000 in the past year and increased operating costs, including wage hikes of \$2,000,000 a year, have combined to depress the company's return to less than 4-1/2 per cent on its investment, the application said. The company's request would permit a return of at least 7 per cent.

Michigan Bell asked the Commission to give consideration to the depreciated value of the dollar in making the determination. Failure to do so, the company said, "will cast an unfair share of the burden of inflation upon investors in the telephone industry."

Most of the fatality reduction was recorded in urban areas and for the second consecutive month, there was a decrease in pedestrian deaths and injuries in both urban and rural areas. Rural areas, however, showed the highest percentage increase in accidents and injuries.

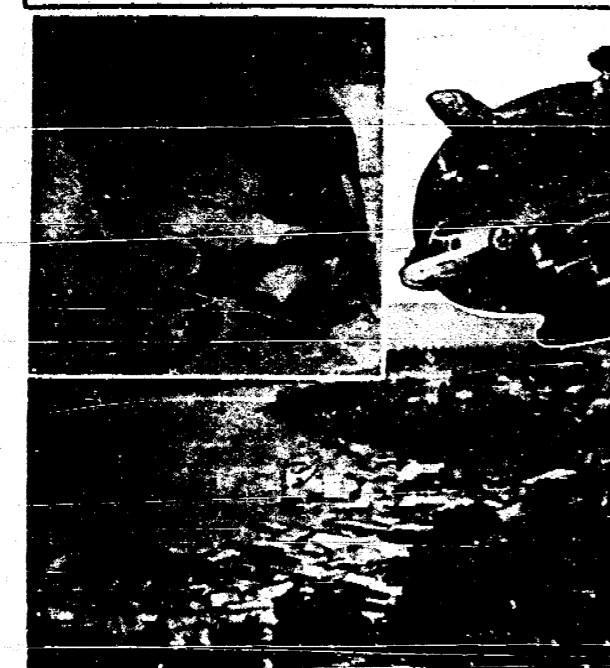

### New Air Service To Caribbean



CANADA has strengthened its economic and social ties with the British West Indies through its operation of Trans-Canada Air Lines between the Dominion and the Caribbean.

The new route adds 1,394 miles to Trans-Canada Air Lines' international service, linking Montreal and Toronto with Nassau in the Bahamas, Kingston, Jamaica and Port-of-Spain in Trinidad. The "North Star" will furnish twice weekly service from Canada and Toronto to Nassau and Jamaica, and once weekly service to Trinidad.

The hundred million mile mark recently achieved by Trans-Canada Air Lines aircraft is equal to 1,390,000 miles.

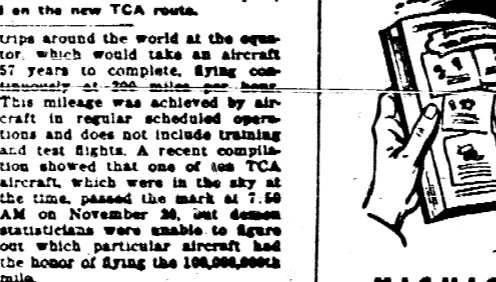

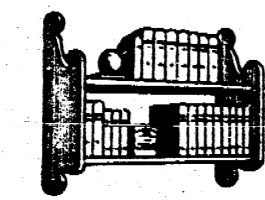

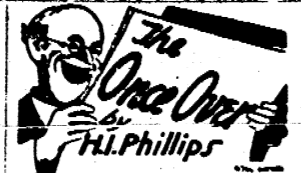

### HOW IS YOUR 'A' PITCH?

If it isn't one thing it's another, now the United Nations is asked to call an international conference on the "A" pitch. This is not a baseball pitcher's maneuver. The "A" pitch is the basic pitch in music, and Dr. Hermann Zetzel, head of the Austrian delegation to the U. N. cultural organization, charges that almost no country is adhering to the standard pitch established in 1859 in Vienna.

Maybe at last here is a clue to what's really wrong with the world. Has man grown careless about his "A" pitch?

Is it possible that the cry, "Sound your A's!" brings on trouble all over the earth?

It is declared by Dr. Zetzel that the original tuning fork used to set the international "A" pitch and kept the world in tune has been preserved in Vienna. He wants everyone to try it. It is not as ridiculous as it sounds (no pun). Nobody has yet been able to put the finger on what is really disturbing the earth so much.

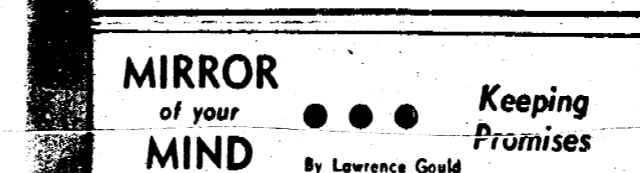

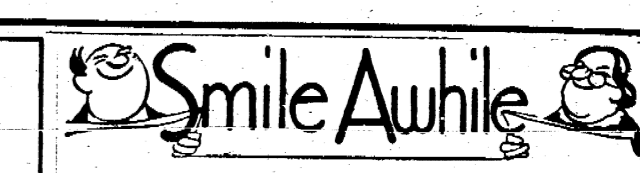
