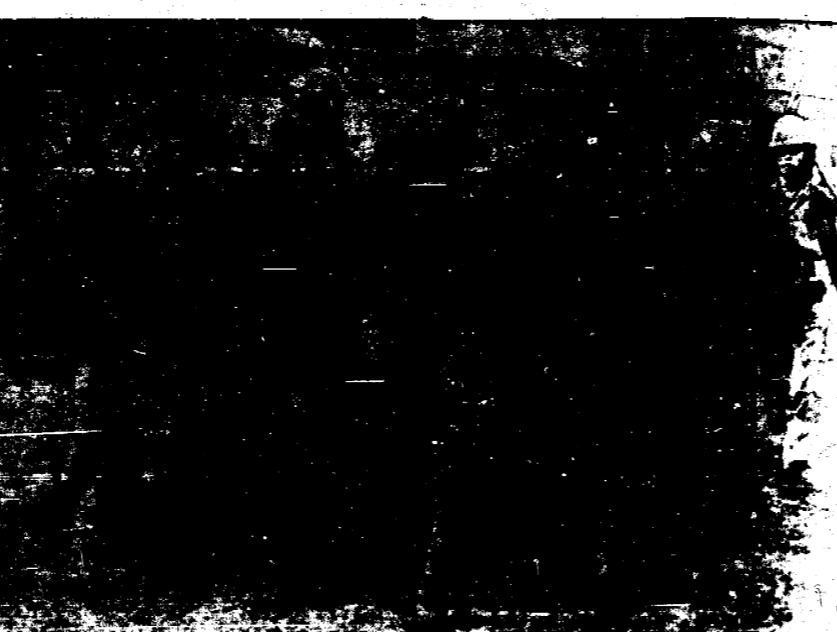

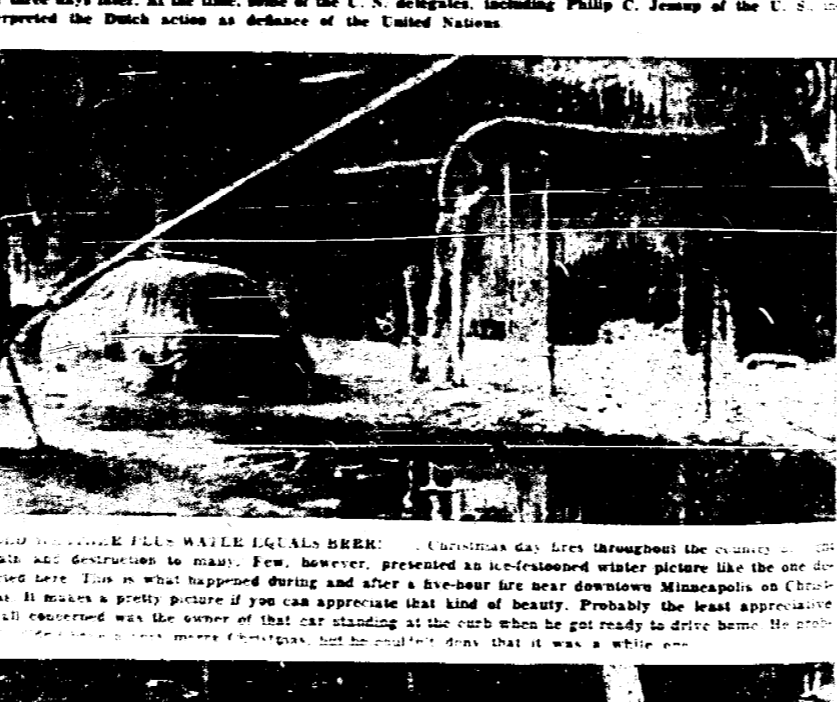

Woman's World Care, Clever Decorative Bits Can Freshen Up Your Wardrobe

AFTER THE HOLIDAYS, before the winter season comes to a close, you may take a look at your wardrobe and wonder just how you can make it do better this time for new clothes.

You'll be happy to learn that a bit of care administered to the right spots, a new scarf or pair of gloves that add color, or perhaps a new blouse that fits the skirt out of the drawers, are all that you'll need.

Now, before you get downright depressed about your wardrobe, it's time to give them those refreshing touches. Check each garment methodically and see what it needs most. Then make out a schedule so that all the work can be covered in a few days or at least less than a week.

If dresses or coats, which have nothing particularly the matter with them, don't look just right to you, whisk them off to the cleaners. It's surprising that a difference there is between clean and unclean clothes.

A sophisticated, forward bent of steel gray felt is designed for the reason by Fagan hats. Ceilings of bleached gray grosgrain plan to give them more attraction in both washing and ironing.

Like a fur collar and cuffs on it, or the former. Wide knit skirts for teen agers will take on a new look if you place a wide piece of quilting at the bottom of the skirt. This is a very new touch and very effective.

Dresses that are not quite long enough might take a contrasting colored hem of grosgrain or some such material. Or, if you like the cuffed effect that is featured on so many skirts, use this piece of the same material as the skirt. Sew it on but place buttons around the hem so that it looks as though it were buttoned rather than sewed on the dress.

Have a Wash Week. Your Washes. Garments will take on new life if they are properly cleaned. If you can't give them a dry cleaning at home, then have it done professionally.

If the cleaning does not add life to them, here's what you can do. First, brush the garment thoroughly. Now turn on the reverse side and place a damp cloth over it. Go over every inch, using a warm or hot iron, and steam. This will remove the pressing cloth and dry the top of the garment will not steam as well as steam you had just pressed, leaving the cloth only somewhat damp.

These fabrics have become slightly more difficult to wash. As it happens sometimes with rayon, there are ways to restore some of its original finish. The garment should be washed in one quart of warm water. Dip the fabric in the solution after regular rinsing. Dry and prepare for steaming as usual.

Velveteens gain new life with this trick: Take a piece of Scotch tape and stick it all around the skirt side up. Run this over the material, changing tape as soon as it gets dirty.

Both velvet and velveteens are refreshed by hanging in the bathroom and turning on the water to create steam. This is the way to remove creases from them. Use the same treatment for hats of these materials.

Other Garments Need Special Attention. Sweaters sometimes get weary after long hard wear during the cool weather. If they have shrunk because of careless washing and are not thoroughly clean, have them done professionally as this will restore some of their original beauty.

You'd find that some sweaters will look better after washing and drying if you go over them with an iron and a pressing cloth that is damp. Do this on the wrong side, just as you treat woollen clothing.

Gloves should come in for their share of mending and cleaning just as other pieces of clothing. Purse should be brushed weekly and have their spots removed as they appear. Have clasps and fasteners changed as they show the need for it.

Felt hats should receive a thorough brushing, and ornaments may be changed as they need freshening. Velvets on any kind of hat take on new life if you lay the velveteen against waxed paper and press with a warm iron.

Shoes may be refreshed by the repair shop if you cannot take care of the finish at home. However, there are good suede and leather cleaners that can do admirably if used properly. Change bows and ornaments if there have been marked out of shape.

Most scarves can be washed just like clothing. Apply gentle laundering methods throughout as most of them are delicate.

Buttons, buckles and belts take a lot of wear, and if they are made by a small maker to change them for new ones rather than repair them.

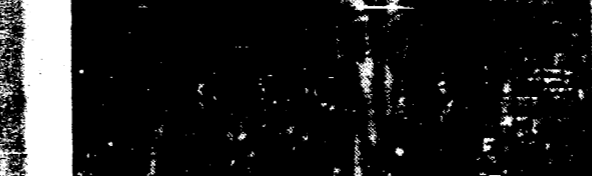
