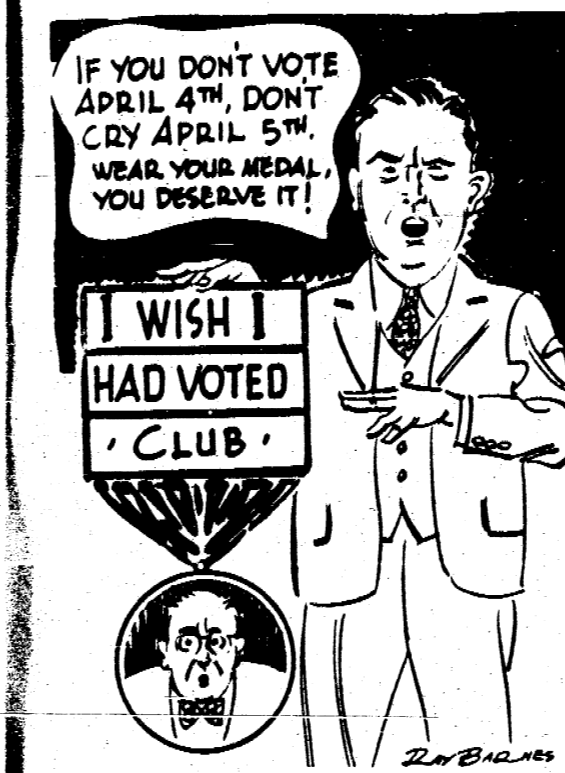

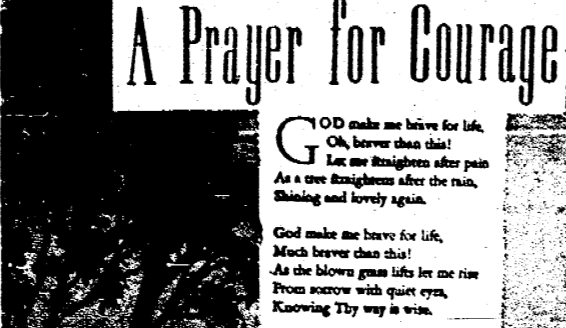

Edmund Hector Bus, 27, of Manchester was held in the County Jail Saturday on a charge of attempting to wreck a Manchester man's car because the man's son "stole" his girl. Bus was arrested Friday on formal charges of malicious destruction of property.

Sheriff's deputies said he admitted attempting to wreck the automobile of Maynard Kidd, Jr., by pounding and scratching on the fenders with a claw hammer and pouring two pounds of sugar in the gas tank. He gave as a reason that Maynard Kidd, Jr. took away his girl, deputies reported.

Deputies said he disclosed attempting to damage the car on two occasions, once when he removed the rotor from the distributor, and the second time when he pounded on it with the hammer.

After the younger Kidd told the officers he had seen the standing near the car with a hammer on the second night it was damaged.

Bus demanded examination when arraigned before Municipal Judge Francis O'Brien Saturday morning. He was returned to the County Jail after he failed to furnish a \$100 bond and property bond. No date was set for the hearing.

In 1944, Gil Deane stepped out of the news and into the limelight. He was called the "Flying Parson" after entering the ministry. He was the first to set a new world indoor mile record of 4:57.3 in New York and was named in the next issue of Chicago at 4:56.1.

When he abandoned sports in 1944 he thought he was through. But he returned to the track in 1947, and had a very successful year, in which he bettered his indoor mile track with a brilliant 4:52.2 in the Milwaukee races. Gil Deane became America's new hope for the 1,500 meters Olympic championship, but never became a reality with a leg injury, and was greatly disappointed, especially after he had secured a contract to race himself with his track and field team.

### Feed Seldom Cause Of Chicken Ills

If you're blaming the feed of your chickens for ailments in the flock, the chances are that you're wrong. The fact lies according to recent research reports received at MSC.

Howard Zindel, MSC extension poultryman, says that tests by the U. S. Department of Agriculture have shown that when feeds are as high as 20 percent in phosphorus, it is almost always a deficiency in the ration used rather than harmful ingredients that cause death or disease symptoms.

The report states that the first impulse of many poultrymen seems to be to take a sample of feed and have an analysis made when disease of unknown origin occurs. Much better diagnosis usually comes by examination of the chickens by a poultry pathologist than by feed analysis.

Certain undesirable conditions in the feed are sometimes caused by dirt it is pointed out. Feather picking and cannibalism are related to diet and management, especially to overcrowding and diets low in fiber and salt.

### Phosphate Use Has Advantage For Some Soils

Michigan farmers can increase crop yields and build up the phosphate supply of their soil by applying super-phosphate this year, says Dr. E. E. Miller, head of the Michigan State College soil science department.

A limited supply of phosphate of the grade running in to 20 percent is now available. It has been difficult to obtain for a number of years since it is used in the manufacture of complete fertilizers. This year, however, sufficient super-phosphate is on hand so it may be bought for direct application.

Complete fertilizers are still hard to obtain in many cases, Dr. Miller points out. Where this is the case, phosphate application has advantages. He says that farmers who are unable to secure their desired complete fertilizer will find that super-phosphate is a good investment.

On soils which have been recently manured, super-phosphate makes a very good fertilizer for many common crops. This is particularly true on the loam and clay loam soils which are relatively high in organic matter. Super-phosphate is not so well balanced for most crops on sandy, loam and sandy soils.
