Question: A few months ago I had all the floors sanded, filled and varnished. I would like to wash them but have been advised not to use water, as it discolors floors. Please advise.

KEEPING HEALTHY Tuberculosis Is Still Common
By Dr. James W. Barton
BEFORE THE X-ray was in general use for examination of the chest for tuberculosis, the physician had to strike the chest wall with his fingers, listen to sounds of the chest by aid of the stethoscope and then look through a microscope at the patient's sputum.
While it would take much time and money to obtain an X-ray of the chest of everybody, it is certainly worth it as it will save many useful lives. To save time and money, and thus get individuals and whole communities to have their chests examined, it has been suggested that the fluoroscope be used in mass surveys.
The advantages of the fluoroscope where the examining physician, by means of an X-ray machine, can look directly into the chest at it shows the extent of the movement of the lungs, and the rhythm and position of the heart by moving the fluoroscope and the patient. The disadvantage of the fluoroscope is that no permanent study record is made for the physician or X-ray specialist. While X-ray of the chest is considered the best single detection method, the physical examination and tuberculin test also are used.



LIST STEPS FOR PARANETE CONTROL

Seven steps to control internal parasites to help insure healthy livestock gains and high production this spring and summer were offered farmers today by the American Foundation for Animal Health.

Parasite invasions cut livestock profits by millions of dollars, causing loss of weight, anemia, unthriftiness and sometimes fatal disease," the Foundation warned. To curb these losses in 1949, farmers were advised as follows:

"If a check-up shows the presence of parasites, have animals treated with an anti-parasitic compound before turning them out to summer pasture.

"Use clean pastures, and practice pasture rotation if possible. A clean pasture is one not grazed last year by the species of livestock that will occupy it this year.

"Dispose of refuse piles that may harbor parasites.

"Provide a clean water supply.

"Avoid overstocking pastures.

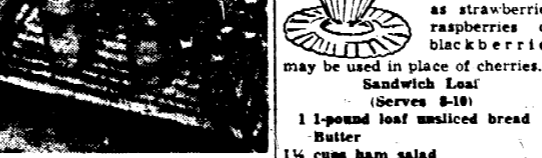

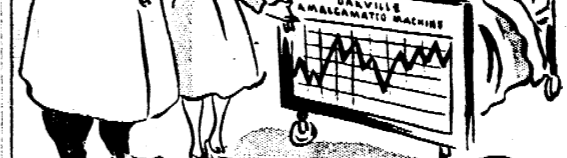

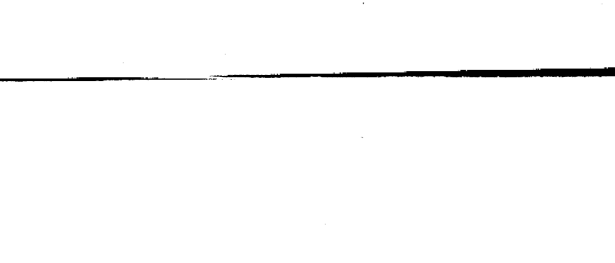

**Washtenaw County To Receive \$32,631.91 In Gas Tax Money**

Washtenaw county will receive \$32,631.91 in gas tax money as part of the first half of 1949 McNitt Act payments, according to State Highway Commissioner Charles M. Ziegler. Vouchers totaling \$2,000,000 in gas tax money have been prepared by the State Highway Department and sent to the Auditor General for payment. Under the provisions of the McNitt Act (Act 210 of the Public Acts of 1911) this money is to be used only on county roads.

The amount of money allocated to any county is based on the number of miles of McNitt roads in that county in proportion to the total McNitt mileage in the state, which is 68,969 miles. The distribution amounts to 85¢ per mile for this year. Mileage is certified to the Highway Department biennially.

McNitt roads, as differing from other county roads, are former township roads which were taken over by the counties under provisions of the McNitt Act, which became effective in 1912.

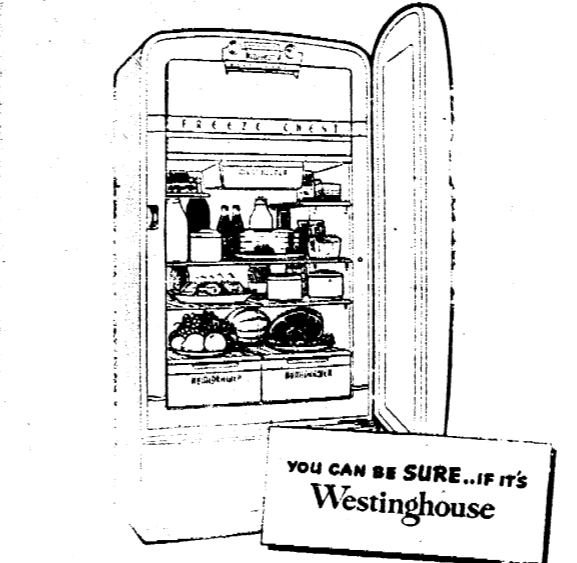

MICHIGAN MIRROR

OVERHAULING of the Michigan tax structure, whereby state and local governments get money to pay for services performed, is proposed by the Michigan Public Expenditure Survey. This group is financed by large taxpayers. Its general interest is economy in government.

HOW MUCH the deficit will be, the legislature's efforts to economize have been carefully appraised, was yet to be determined at the time of the journal. The state sales tax is already producing less each month, as a decline in prices brings a decline in tax revenue.

"IN HIS tax message, the Governor said, 'Our patch-work tax structure is badly in need of general revision. He did not, however, recommend such a revision at present on the ground that 'time is so short if we are to avoid a financial crisis.'

"SOMEONE once said, 'You can't have your cake and eat it too.' Michigan taxpayers paid a total of \$2.4 billion in taxes for the 1947-48 fiscal year ending July 1. Of this amount \$343.2 million was collected by the state; \$247.2 million by local governments, and the remainder by the federal government.
