The directors of the Manchester Community Fund will meet at the Manchester Township Library Monday night, August 29, at 8:00 for election of officers.

Plans are now complete for the opening of the Manchester Public Schools. A pre-school conference and organization meeting will be held for the teachers on Tuesday, September 6th, at the high school, followed by a reception of all the teachers at one of the nearby lakes later in the day.

The bus tickets will be sent to the schools sometime this week and if anyone of the prospective riders have been omitted they are asked to contact Supt. Downing.

"Additional allotments for transportation of pupils shall be made to graded school districts transporting pupils with handicaps but living outside the village limits and more than one mile from school."

### MICHIGAN MIRROR

Has your hometown attracted new industries since V-J days? Many small towns in Michigan have.

Any traveler in Michigan who visits small towns is instantly impressed with this fact. Industrial decentralization—the 120 drive for the splitting up of big business into little businesses is putting new payrolls and pop into many Michigan communities of less than 10,000 population.

EVEN HENRY FORD II has concluded that the River Rouge plant, soon to be the stage for another costly and wasteful effort, has become too big to be run efficiently. The maris of the City of Detroit was cracked up to be for both the manufacturer and the worker. Hence the continuing trend of industry into small cities and towns.

A "MICHIGAN Mirror" survey offers three good examples of Michigan small towns which have attracted new industries since the war:

Gladstone—\$80,000 branch plant of the Coleman Canning Company of Coleman, Wisconsin. From 150 to 200 persons will be employed during season.

Albion—Globe Milling Co. Baldwin Packing Material company making cartons and mounts for refrigerators and stoves. (Union demands for same wage scale as Detroit.) Flint has resulted in plant shutdown at frequent intervals.

St. Ignace—Paul Dugan Company and Barrett Logging Co. manufacturers of FHA-approved half-inch plywood or prefabricated homes and producers of lumber and logs, kiln dried.

Claro—Clarco Manufacturing Company, home industry which makes carburetor parts for Ford Motor Company. Payroll for 50 to 400 persons.

Cedar Springs—The "Red" Foundation is a new industry. Blockfast, Inc., which moved from Grand Rapids and makes high grade wooden blocks and toy departments. Payroll for 30 persons.

St. Johns—Sealed Power Corporation with 200 employees makes piston rings. Division of Mackay Corp. Also, Federal-Mogul Corporation, also with 200 workers, a division of a Detroit plant.

Harrisville—A group of businessmen of Harrisville formed the Harrisville Development Association to lengthen the area and attract new industries. Building was by D. L. Erb and Marshall J. Hiron, makers of "Knawood" winter garments.

Sturgis—Six new industries flourish here for 270 persons and \$12,150 weekly payroll. Grava-Flow Company, plumbing equipment; Sanitor Company, restroom equipment; Sturgis Carton Company, packing cartons; Sturgis Foundry Company, auto parts; Universal Diesel Company, Diesel engine parts, and M & B Electric Laboratory, Inc., processed milk foods. M & B is a branch of Columbus, Ohio, concern. Others are independent.

Newberry—Atlas Plywood Company, employing 120; Flint River Ply and Lumber Co., employing 40. Both are branch firms.

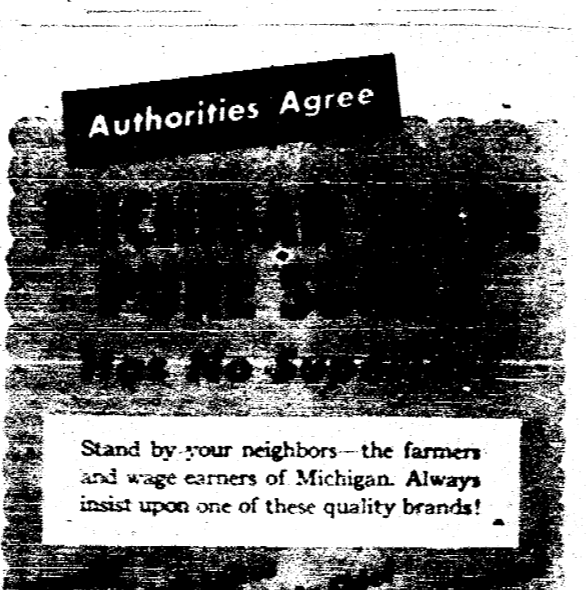
Bangor—Here is one of the top Michigan small towns in point of industrial progress. Lister has six new industries furnish employment for approximately 500 persons; 150 new homes built during the past 18 months. Municipally owned baseball, softball, football park rebuilt and lighted. Village debt free. Six new business buildings in past two years.

The firms: Standard Coil Products of Chicago firm; De Wel Metal products from Chicago in 1946, employs 80 men; Bangor Plastics, branch of Benton Harbor firm; Howard Edgington Co., from Otsego; Well-Made Farms Company, foster branch of Chicago meat factory.

### TB Declining in Michioan

Tuberculosis in Michigan continues to lose ground in one of the major public health advances in the state's history. Dr. John Cowan, Director of the Division of Tuberculosis and Venereal Disease Control, said today.

The disease which took the lives of 104 persons in every 100,000 of the state's population in 1900, took the lives of only 25 per 100,000 population in 1948. The disease has been pushed from second to ninth cause of death in the state in the past half century.

Credit for victories in the battle against tuberculosis should probably be given to improved methods of treatment which made huge onlays on the disease in the 1920 and 1930's and to new "wonder" drugs recently put in use; to better case-finding including the mobile chest x-ray units of the Michigan Department of Health; to federal purchases of units for x-ray of persons entering general hospitals and x-ray services of industries and other organizations; as well as to prompt hospitalization made possible by better case-finding. Other considerable factors in the state's success are the hospitalization of the tuberculous, and the work of state and county tuberculosis associations.

Michigan now stands seventeenth among the 48 states with its death rate of 25.2 and its rate compares favorably with the national rate of 28.9.

Dr. Cowan pointed out that while at the turn of the century it is Michigan, "Consumption" struck down frail young women and children in their school years, tuberculosis is now taking on an entirely different aspect. Almost two-thirds of the 1948 deaths from the disease were among men and more than two-thirds of the deaths were of people over 40 years of age.

Further advances against the disease will be made through increased case-finding among Michigan people who are in the last half of their "three score and ten", Dr. Cowan said.

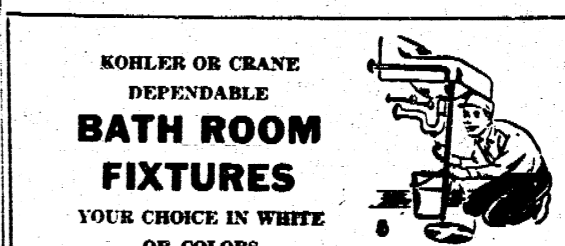
