### Feeding Costs Cut by Pasture

Successful livestock producers plan to make maximum use of good pasture and roughage because of the big savings possible in feeding costs. Says Gordon Blank, extension specialist in animal husbandry at Michigan State college:

Good pasture will save 15 percent of the grain and 50 percent of the protein in the winter ration. Blank states that 20 pigs are pastured per acre this year amount to a savings of \$60 or more in feed costs. Since 60 percent of the feed consumed by sheep is roughage and pasture, the savings from good feed of this type is even more pronounced, the specialist believes. Last year Hill Bros. of Farmington, Michigan's 1946 Champion Flockmasters, sent 142 lambs to market from 88 ewes. These ewes averaged only 40 pounds and were marketed

directly from pasture without receiving grain. The cheapest possible gain with best cattle is that made on good pasture and roughage. Blank points out that Michigan State college experiments have shown that feeding steers on mixed legume and grain pasture earned from one to two pounds a day during the grazing season. Cows varied from three to seven cents a pound on pasture, while cost of gain on similar steers fed grain in the dry lot ranged from 12 to 15 cents a pound.

State game farms in 22 states raise or buy pheasants for stocking programs according to a survey made by the Massachusetts conservation department.

### CONSERVATION DEPT.

## PLANTS 238,000 LEGAL SIZE TROUT IN APRIL

Advanced spring weather, which lured thousands of fishermen to the state's trout waters, also permitted the conservation department to finish the April planting of 238,000 legal size hatchery fish.

General consensus of reports from department regional offices indicates more fishermen were out, streams normal and clear and mostly fair catches.

Pressroom planting in the upper peninsula included 30,000 brook, 8,000 brown and 7,000 rainbow trout. Waters in the northern half of the lower peninsula received 35,000 brook, 54,000 brown, 48,000 rainbow and 11,000 lake trout. Fish planting crews released 24,000 rainbow, 11,000 brown and 10,000 brook trout in southern Michigan waters.

The conservation department was able to plant a total of 2,435,592 fingerling, sub-legal and legal trout in 1948. Last year the department nearly realized its goal of a million legal sized brook, brown and rainbow trout with 987,882 planted.
