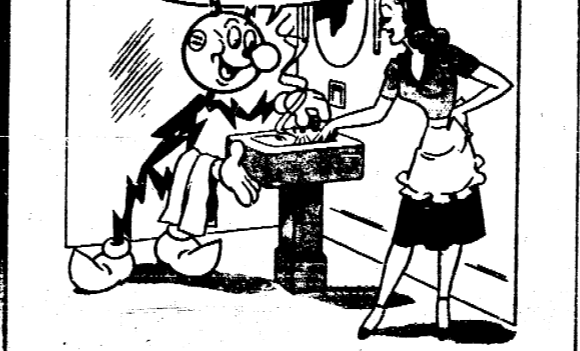

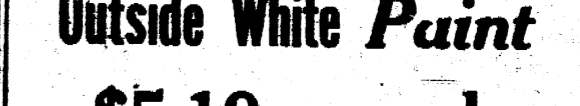

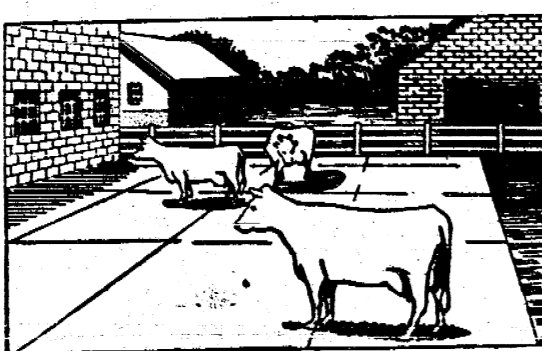
WALZ REUNION

PAVED BARNYARD HELPS KEEP COWS AND DAIRY BARN CLEAN



With cleanliness the watchword on the modern dairy farm, barnyards are a big help in keeping cows and dairy barns clean.

When mud is knee deep in dirt lots, cows on a paved barnyard are high and dry—free from the dirt that harbors disease, and when cows are kept out of the mud, much time is saved in cleaning them before milking. Besides, mud and dirt are not tracked into the barn and barn cleaning chores are further reduced.

On a paved barnyard cows can get their needed exercise in all kinds of weather. According to the National Paved Barnyard Association, paved barnyards give greater protection from such infections as foot rot and mastitis.

A paved barnyard can be easily cleaned and all the value measures saved. Some dairymen believe that the saving in manure alone pays for the paved job. And because a paved barnyard can be cleaned easily, flies are deprived of the fifth in which to breed.

How to Make Floor

For each head of cattle, 30 to 40 square feet of paved yard is recommended. Paved yards are usually made about 4 inches thick; where heavy tracks are driven they are made 6 inches thick.

Place pavements in sections 10 feet square. In this way you can place the concrete as time allows. Areas next to the barn and around feed tanks are usually laid first. Use 2 1/2 in. for the side forms and the floor is 4 inches thick, 2 in. thick on the ends.

Make a masonry mix in the proportion of 1 sack portland cement, 2 1/2 cubic feet sand, 3 1/2 cubic feet gravel. Use 3/4 in. round gravel. Use 3/4 in. round gravel. Use 3/4 in. round gravel.

As soon as the concrete stiffens cover it with straw or earth and keep it moist for about 5 days by sprinkling.

It takes about 7 1/2 sacks a portable cement, 1 cubic yard of sand, and 1 cubic yard of gravel or crushed rock to build 100 square feet of floor 4 inches thick.

Questions, Answers Concerning School Bus Problems

Now that the Board of Education has approved two buses for school transportation the question of transporting pupils living within the district is a logical one to discuss.
