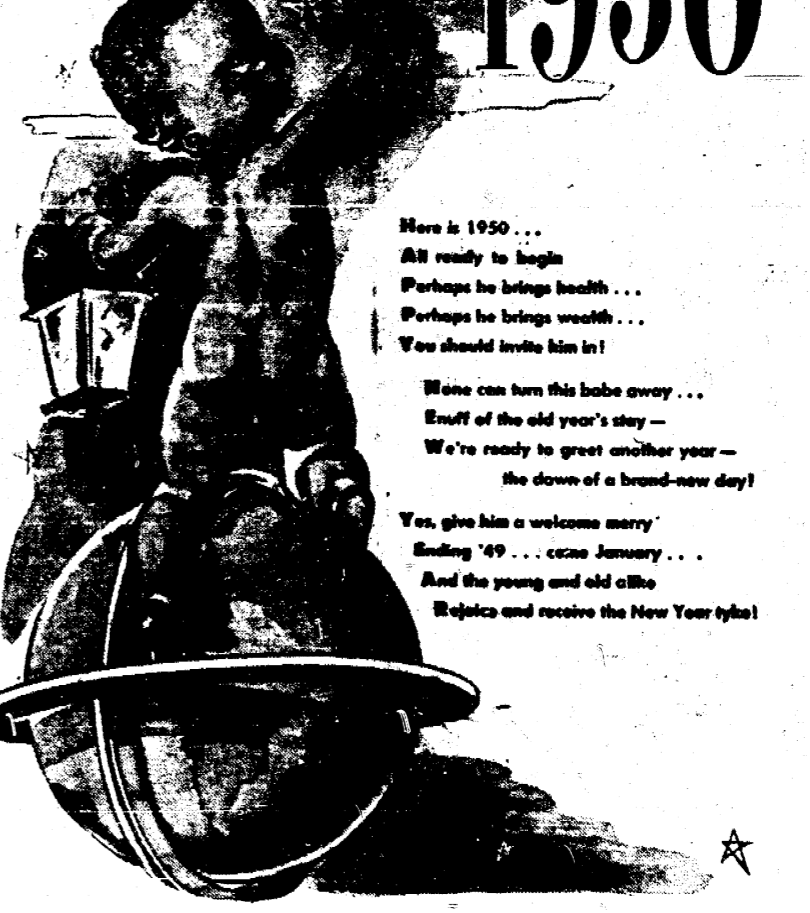

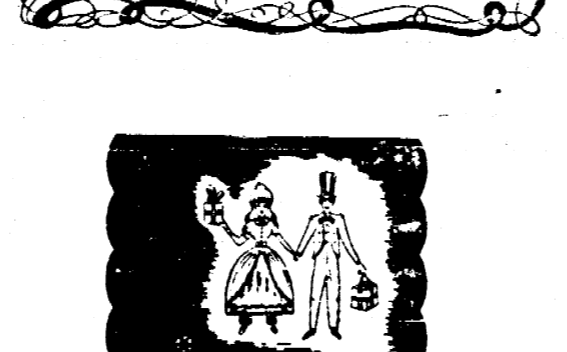

Worktown Battle Of 1781 Featured In U-M Broadcast

Letters signed by George Washington and Lord Cornwallis and reports on British and American armies—these are part of the collection of original materials relating to the Battle of Yorktown now being broadcast by the University of Michigan.

The story of that battle, the last of the American Revolution, is being told by University of Michigan radio actors in the last of a series of dramatic programs entitled "Treasures Off the Shelf." All have been based on original documents of American history from the Clements Library.

Manchesters, Michigan, Dec. 16, 1949. Council met in special session. Called to order by President Kirk, present trustees, Widmayer, Lannom, Kappler, Bretschwiler, Kuebler and Huber.

Purpose of the meeting was to reconsider the replacement of our Boulevard lamps with overhead lamps.

Motion was made by Ferdinand C. Huber and supported by Wallace Widmayer that Consumers Power Company of Jackson, Michigan, be requested to

remove the 36 2500 Boulevard lamps now on Main St. Clinton and install in their place 33 wood standards carrying 6000 lumen overhead lamps on Main street between Clinton and Riverside streets and one wood standard carrying a 10,000 lumen lamp on the west side of Adams street between Main and the alley. Also, to install 9 6000 lumen lamps on 12 foot mast arms mounted on the selected black wood poles on W. Main street between Union and Clinton streets and one 6000 lumen lamp on S. Clinton street at the west end of the alley and one 6000 lumen lamp on the east end of the alley.
