### Washtenaw County C. D. Plan

Another step in the ceaseless fight against cancer is seen in the Washtenaw County Tumor Detection Program. This plan is sponsored by Washtenaw County and the Ann Arbor Branches of the American Cancer Society, The Washtenaw County Health Department and the Washtenaw County Medical Society. The plan represents a carefully developed, closely integrated, cooperative effort mentioned above. The program is designed to detect early stages of cancer in all citizens of Washtenaw County, and of persons who have lived in the county at regular periodic intervals.  
 How the Plan Works: The program, which has the support and approval of medical and lay health groups, is a simple one. Patients desiring examination need only call their physician and family doctor for a C. D. or cancer detection examination. At that time the physician will obtain necessary further study of the body which has the necessary reference to those areas of the body which contribute to over 90 per cent of cancer cases. This includes the skin, mouth, breasts, cervix, prostate and rectum. If suspicious changes are noted by the physician in any of the organs examined he will advise the necessary further study. Some of the studies required to determine this for this. In the first place physicians are called upon to perform a physical exam for many and varied ways out of a paper bag, while there are more penetrating than a high-velocity bullet. Such tests can be stepped by a sheet of cellulose, which high-power x-rays require several inches of lead to control cancer.  
 A Few Points to Remember: Simply call your physician and health of such organs will be advised.  
 While all physicians have been alerted to make a C. D. (cancer detection) examination, those seeking appointments for this purpose should specifically request cancer detection examination. There are several reasons for this: an appointment for a C. D. (cancer detection) examination along with other examinations may be made. The cost for a C. D. examination is the physician's charge made for physical examination. Since he is your physician and he probably cared for you before, his fee is doubtless already known to you. Patients who desire cancer detection examination, but who cannot, on their own, afford this service, may request assistance from either the Washtenaw County (phone Ypsilanti 5364) or the Ann Arbor branch (phone Ann Arbor 2-5676) of the American Cancer Society.
