

ter actually inside hossehold will be radioactive. If a little is drawn off right after the burst and placed in clean containers with covers, it should tide you over the immediate post-raid period.

post-raid period.

But even if the wafer contisues running, don't keep on using tap water for drinking purposes unless you have received official information that the city system is safe. This is not only because of radioactivity, but because of other dangers like tyhpoid that can come from damaged water systems. If you have to use city water before you get official information, boil it. Boiling won't remove radioactivity, but the chances that your water supply will be radioactive are pretty slim. Boiling will kill most germs that may get into damaged water mains.

What About Radios and Telephones

Neither explosive nor lingering radioactivity has any effect on the operation of most mechanical or electrical devices. Unless the wires are down or there is a power lailure, both your lights and telephone should continue to work. But don't rush to the phone just to find out how Aunt Susie weathered the attack. Leave the lines then for real emergency traf-
