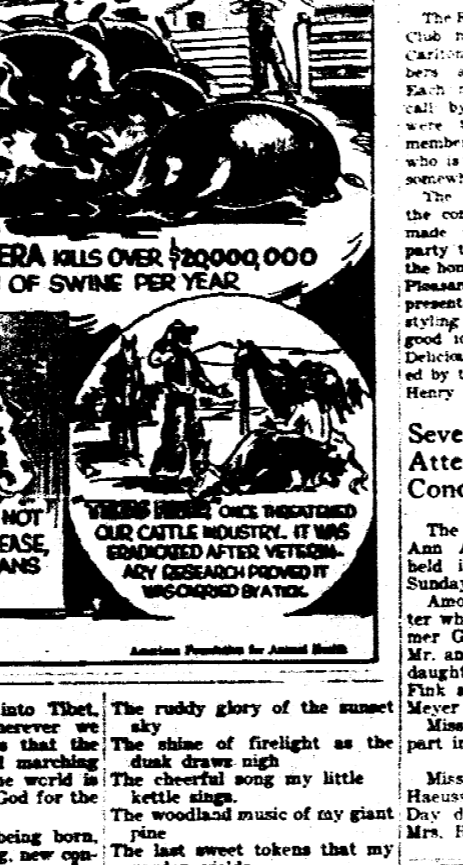

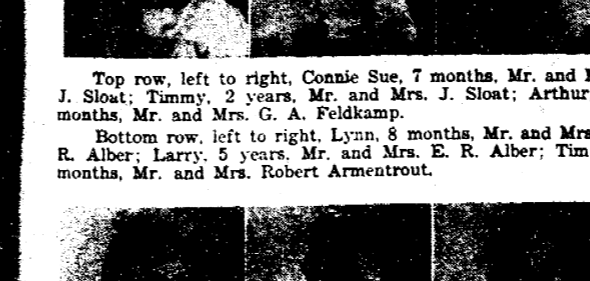

Your New Social Security

A farmer came into the Jackson Social Security office the other day and said, 'I've heard that the new social security law covers farmers. I operate a farm of my own...'

Well, some farm people will come under social security on January first—but not farm operators. They will continue to be excluded because farm self-employment is not covered under the amended Social Security Act.

If I were addressing you in a hall at this point, there would be a number of questions. First, you'd want to know what is meant by a regularly employed farm worker. Well, under the new social security law, generally, he is a person employed by one farm operator on a full-time basis for a period of several months. Now to answer the second question I know you would ask: A calendar quarter is a three-month period beginning on January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1.

But back to the subject of a regularly employed farm worker. Let's take a typical example. We'll call such a farm worker Ed Smith. He is employed by Howard Jones. Ed has heard about the new social security, too. He has a wife and children, and he's looking forward to January when he can start building toward old-age and survivors insurance.

Now, let's look forward to January first. That's the date when regular farm work begins to count toward social security insurance. Ed will be qualified for social security if he must earn not less than \$50 in cash wages for his work on those 60 or more days. As long as he continues to do this kind of work for Jones in each calendar

quarter, and earns \$50 or more cash wages for his work in that quarter, his earnings will be credited toward old-age and survivors insurance. That's 60 days for Jones, although he

What this all means is that a farm worker, to have his cash wages count toward old-age and survivors insurance, must first work continuously through a calendar quarter to establish a service relationship. Then he should take advantage of the snowfall. Many birds will come to the feeding station when they must take shelter from the storm. Michigan birds have perfectly adequate feather covering and if they have sunflower seeds, Dr. Sutton said. But wait for that first heavy snow fall. In just a couple of days the birds will develop a habit of coming to your feeding station.

Describing the favorite food items, Dr. Sutton noted that many birds are very fond of sunflower seeds. Birds usually make arrangements with a farmer to save sunflower heads for them. These are

strung up for the birds and are a great favorite with downy and hairy woodpeckers, chickadees and tufted titmouse. The cardinal likes this food, too, but for the bird the seed should be placed on the ground, as he dislikes flying up to get it. Other foods which will attract the birds are cracked nuts, bakery nuts, peanuts and black walnuts, and of course, the lump of suet tucked in a trunk of a tree or placed in a container of kitchen wire through which the birds can peck.

One of the prettiest birds you can have as a guest during the winter is the evening grosbeak, a black-white-olive green and yellow bird about the size of a robin. Dr. Sutton said, 'Bobwhites may be seen at winter feeding stations occasionally. The brown creeper, a small defenseless brown, grey and white bird with slender curved bill, will often slip in when the other birds have finished and will stay as long as the others will let him. The titmouse and chickadee can get bold enough to eat out of your hand. Dr. Sutton said.
