Public Pinched Between Miners-Operators

To sum up the coal situation in the nation as of the past few days, it appears there are both too many miners and unlimited coal deposits. John L. Lewis, trying to equalize work in the industry and spread it out among the miners by limiting the work week to three days, was met by the walk-out of 100,000 miners demanding a five day work week. The industry is of the opinion that the market must determine which mines will work and how much, not the union. Also, the cheaper coal is produced, the cheaper it is sold on the market, the more it will be used.

The question as to who is right is debatable. It is our opinion however, that in a situation of this magnitude, after a thorough investigation of the coal industry by a competent board, their decision should be enforced with the government stepping into the picture.

In our village an emergency does not exist in the same sense of the word as reported to the President in the present national crisis.

We are fortunate in this locality to have sufficient coal to meet current demands, "if" as Mr. Buss of the Buss Coal Co. put it, "they aren't too choosy". Pochatons and stoker coal are at a premium. Present coal supply on hand at the Buss coal yard is in the neighborhood of 75 tons. The supply under normal conditions would be five to six hundred tons.

Asked if the price had been affected due to the strike, Mr. Buss replied there had been slight increases from time to time which had been absorbed by both the dealer and the public.

The Schaffer Lumber Company also reports on hand some two hundred tons of hard and soft coal, and slack galore.

A very few, it was stated by both companies, have converted to oil because of the prevailing conditions.

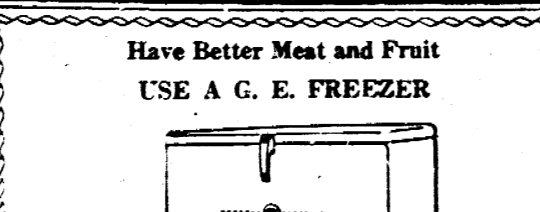

How to Start a Paint Job With a Brand-New Brush Do you know how to "break in" a new paint brush? Electron in New Field A new experimental technique developed at the national bureau of standards uses the electron as a probe to explore electric and magnetic fields of extremely small dimensions. The results take the form of a photograph which shows for the magnetic studies, the direction and administered by a magnetic forces about any small magnetized object. Thus it is now possible to photograph and study the minute "atomic magnets" within magnetic materials-magnets so small that the use of a probe any larger than an electron would obscure the effects they produce. 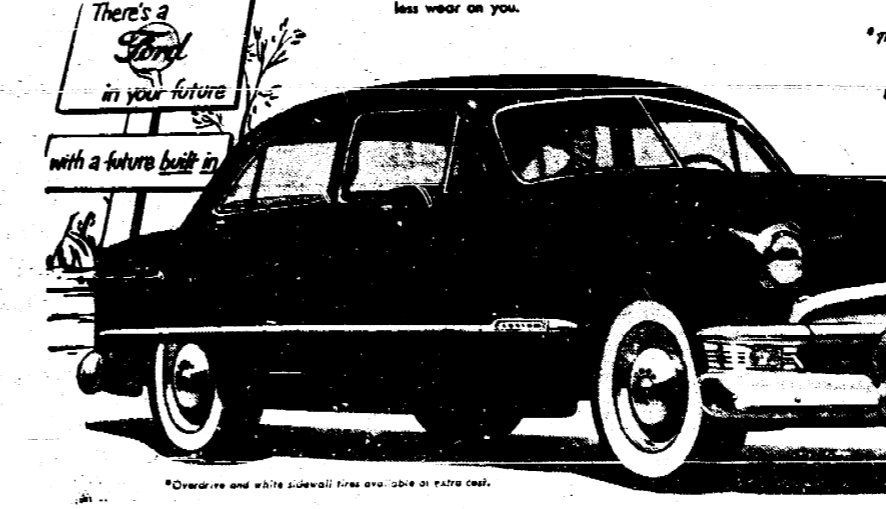
