Doctors At Wayne U. Reverse Blood Stream and Avoid Leg Amputations



By using an unobstructed vein to channel blood into the leg, doctors have saved legs that might otherwise have been amputated. The technique involves grafting together the unobstructed part of the artery and the vein, thus reversing the direction of flow in the vein and sending blood-carrying fresh blood to the starved tissue. The blood returns to the heart through other veins.

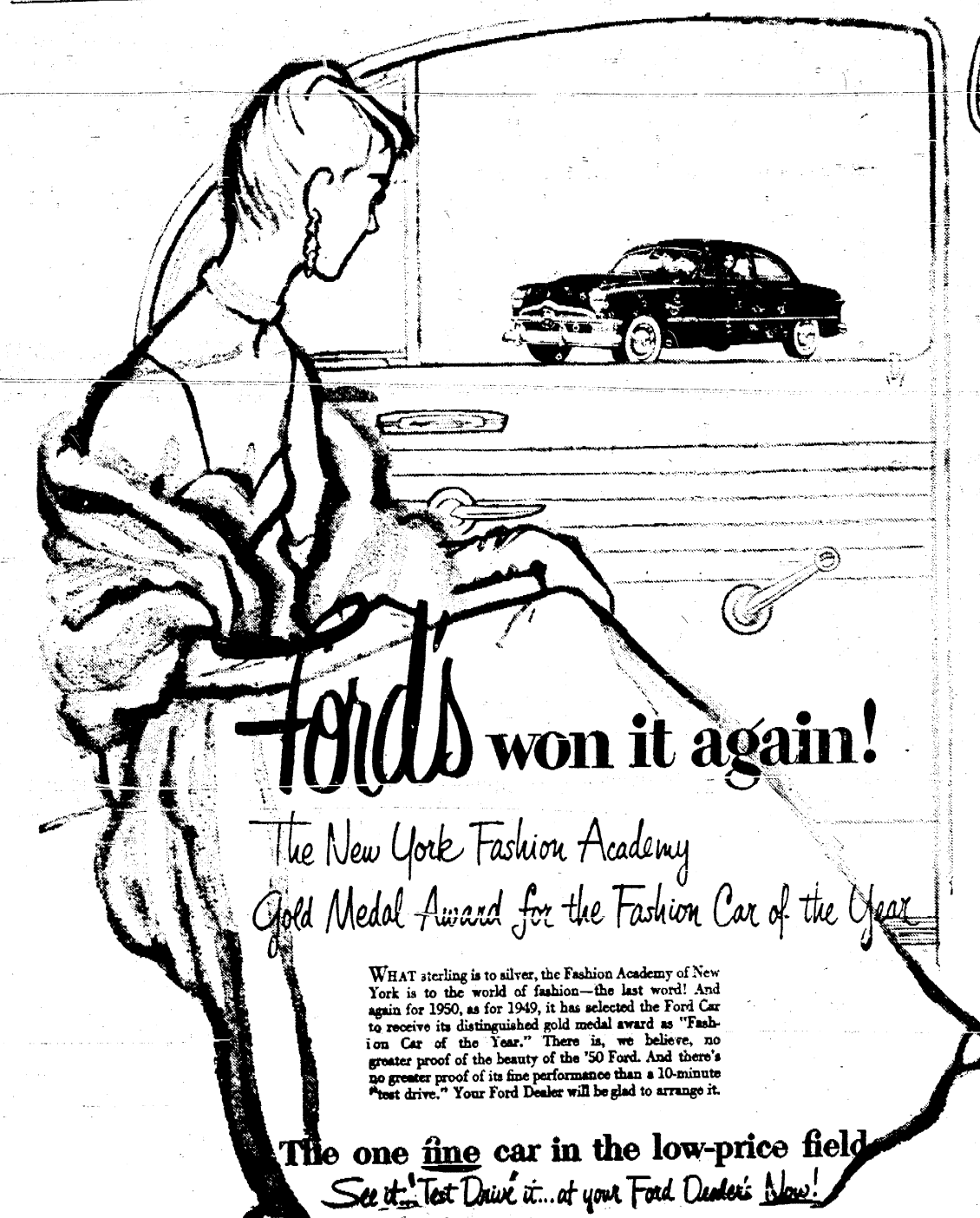

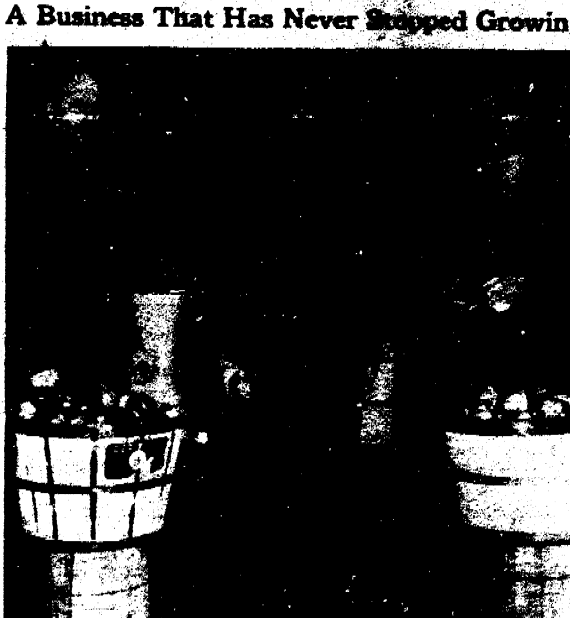
