FARMERS FIND GRASS SILAGE GOOD FORAGE

Great interest in grass silage in Michigan is being shown primarily because it is a way to put up hay and save more of the nutrients. Surveys made by Michigan State College researchers in nine central Michigan counties show 500 per cent more farmers made grass silage in 1949 than made it in 1948.

Most of the farmers are using the first cutting of legume-grass fields or hay crop silage. Michigan weather conditions are usually not too good for putting up first-cutting hay. Under usual hay-making methods it is estimated that from 20 to 40 per cent of the feed value of the first cutting of hay is lost from weather damage.

Field-cured hay can be safely stored at around 25 per cent moisture. This means that about 15 to 20 hours of sunshine are required for curing. With a mower-drier, hay can be stored at about 40 per cent moisture, but relatively few farmers have mowers.

With grass silage stored by the wilting method the crop can be stored at 70 to 75 per cent moisture. This normally takes about one to three hours of sunshine.

MSU surveys showed that in 1949 about two-thirds of the farmers started filling their silos the first two weeks of June. Cutting when the legume is at one-quarter blossom is more important than the date, however.

First cutting from new seedlings accounted for 40 per cent of the grass silage on farms visited—the crop usually being alfalfa-brome. As farmers know, ball or roll and when the hand grass crops in June to tide their silos the forage rapidly falls apart, the silage is too dry. Some water needs to be added as it is put in the silo.

Many farmers are using excess grass silage for a forage crop.

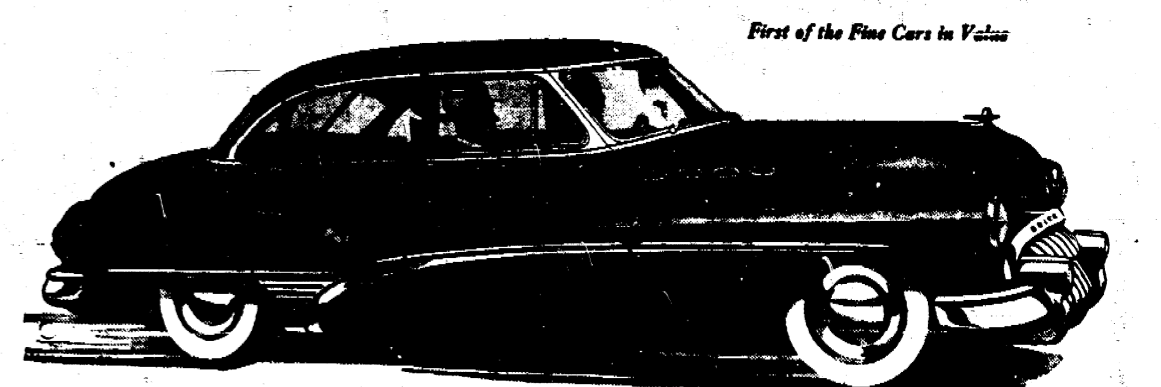
