British Retreat, American Troops Recapture Detroit (Editor's Note: Today newspaper readers accept on-the-spot accounts of events as commonplace. This hasn't always been true. In the story below

An event in September of 1813 is recorded in modern textbooks. This is the fourth in a series of stories based on eyewitness accounts in books and other material in the Michigan Historical Collections at the University of Michigan.

Detroit, September 29, 1813—Detroit was recaptured today by American troops under Brigadier General Duncan McArthur.

There was great rejoicing among the Americans in Detroit. Many of them wept tears of joy at the sight of the Stars and Stripes again flying proudly over the town.

The newly assembled American fleet, under command of Captain Oliver H. Perry, departed into Detroit today from across the river by Major General William Henry Harrison while the main body of American troops continued eastward in pursuit of the British.
