We have seen considerable work stoppage lately. This i nothing new. We have seen strikes for many years in the past we shall no doubt see strikes for many years in the future. But it is not my purpose to discuss the right to quit work.

What I want to consider is the right to work.

If there is any one principle fundamental to the American way of life that is more important than all others, it is the right of the individual to make a living. It is part of the individual freedom that is the back of any constitutional resulting forms. that is the basis of our constitutional republican form of govern ment. To deny the individual that right is to deny him his rights as an American citizen, is to thrust upon him an insidious

The slavery involved in the denial to the individual of his The slavery involved in the denial to the individual of his right to work it not too apparent—and perhaps for that reason is extremely dangerous. But anything that denies a man his individual freedom, his right to carve out his own destiny, his right to plan his own career and provide for the welfare of himself and his family, is slavery just the same. No amount of camouflage will change it. Organized groups should not be able to take advantage of particular situations by forcing their will on the free individual citizens of America. will on the free individual citizens of America.

Those who do not want to work have no right to deny employment to those who do wish to work. The union closed shop does just this.

The slavery produced by the closed shop is a type to which no man who believes in free democratic government can submit. If the worker can have his rights taken away from him in this manner by labor bosses with the sanction of a bueaucratic gov ernment, then he had just as well live under a dictatorship or communistic form of government, neither of which does mor than deny him the same rights.

#### FINANCING DEFENSE-THE TAX PROGRAM

The tax bill just passed by the House of Representatives is the largest and probably the most badly devised tax measure in our history. At a time when we are relying heavily on increased production to strengthen our defense, the new tax bill incorporates confiscatory rates on individuals and corporations and hus levels serious blows against the nation's productive machine by destroying incentives to build up production. The tax bill passed by the House shows fundamental short-

comings in all three main categories of tax revenue-individual income, corporate income tax and excises.

Individual Income Tax

When we need millions of men in the armed forces, the ernment must call men from all income groups. Similarly, Congressman George Meader when we need billions of additional revenue to pay for war expenditures, the government should levy taxes on all incomes. penditures, the government should levy taxes on all incomes. The new rates, which are far above the peak wartime rates, would make it practically impossible for corporations to find the funds needed to keep production going at a high level and to expand production.

The excise increases embodied in the House bill expand the present illogical, inequitable, and discriminatory group of excises. The result is too little and too late in excise revenue.

Since excises should be levied on the broadest possible base, it is easy to understand the difficulties that the House faced when it decided to avoid the logical solution of levying a uniform excise tax at a moderate rate. To get substantial revenues, the House was forced to levy heavier special taxes on automobiles, on gasoline, on cigarettes and on liquor. Their burden will inevitably fall in a selective and discriminatory way on people with moderate and low incomes.
