This change from the traditional Saturday night opening for local retailers was first announced two weeks ago by the Chamber of Commerce after a survey of the downtown stores revealed such a preference, it was said.

The new LeRot Tractor, ordered by the Village Council early in March, arrived in Chelsea last week. The specialty tractor with dual rear wheels is a versatile piece of equipment which with the aid of various attachments, can be used for light grading work; for removing snow from leaves and loading them on a truck; as a street sweeper; or as a mower. The rotary sweeper and the mower attachment had not yet arrived here but the straight backfill blades to be used for backfilling, snow removal, or light grading work and the front end loader bucket attachments arrived in place.

Only one man is needed to operate the tractor and his equipment and changing from one attachment to another can be quickly accomplished. The loader bucket requires only one pin to hold it in place.

The mower attachment will have a fixed cutter bar and the rotary sweeper will be 84 inches long.

Cost of the new equipment was listed as \$4,235 less an allowance of \$635 on the old Worthington compressor.
