



Even to Americans, accustomed since childhood to the unique miles of an election year, the origin and organization of a national political Convention may be somewhat mysterious. How did we arrive at this method of choosing Presidential candidates?

Nominating Conventions were not in the plans of the Founding Fathers, who aphorred political parties in any case. It was their idea that Wise menofrom each state would put their heads to-gether and choose the best man for the job.
