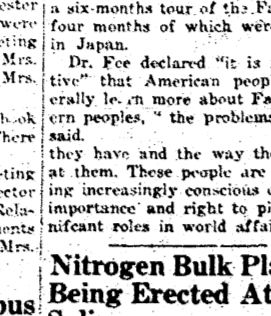

Dr. John Guy Fawcett, Dean of the School of Education at the University of Wisconsin, and other leaders will also participate in the program. Citizens will be able to learn first hand how their schools are financed. They will be shown by graphs and charts that many school districts escape local tax dollars by receiving state subsidies as completely as others pay as much as \$100 million to support their schools. It will be shown, too, that some districts have enough funds to provide their children with the finest educational programs, while in others there is lack of teaching personnel, supplies and equipment.

Spending a Nickel To Save a Dollar

Spending a nickel to save a dollar. Moneywise, that's the sound reasoning behind the new 12-point tuberculosis control program before the State Legislature, the Michigan Tuberculosis Association said this week. In its budget for next year, the Michigan Department of Health has requested an added \$901,183, "chiefly to find tuberculosis victims earlier, before the disease has been spread."

Until TB cases are found earlier, the tuberculosis association quoted health department officials as "seeing no relief from mounting TB treatment costs, which have reached an all-time high of more than \$2 million Michigan tax dollars every year." Activities which would be intensified by the \$901,183 appropriation include: (1) mass chest x-ray campaigns; (2) routine chest x-rays of persons admitted to general hospitals, among whom incidence of TB is high; (3) intensive testing surveys; (4) medical-social service, to help prevent spread of TB; (5) a central case register to give "vital data" on TB cases; and (6) aid to special projects of local health departments, where personnel is inadequate.
