**East Europe Fears Key Storm**

Reports reaching Vienna from Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Poland and Rumania speak of "deep pessimism" among the people as a result of the failure of the Four-Power Berlin conference. They fear, the reports say, that the outcome of the Berlin meeting will bring an intensification of the "cold war" which will make it even more difficult for the Church to exercise some spiritual influence.

The present relative calm in the East is not expected to last, the reports say. They believe the calm before the storm which, any day, may break loose with greater fury than ever. Some reports say that since early this year plans are in preparation for the liquidation of the remaining class enemies. These plans are said to include the elimination of all remaining "reactionary" class leaders and the physical destruction of many Christian middle class families.

**Magnesium Fed Apples In Cover Crop**

It takes longer than one year to correct magnesium deficiency in apple orchards, warns C. A. Langer, Michigan State College horticulturist. So far, no soil treatments have corrected this deficiency in mature apple trees.

The trend toward low magnesium levels was noted in a study of apple orchards in Michigan last year. Langer notes the strong inter-relationship between potassium, calcium and magnesium. When potassium is low, calcium and magnesium are usually high. This relationship may have some bearing on the deficiency of potassium.

**Survey Shows Grapes Lack In Potassium**

Potassium seems to be the element most needed for better grape yields in Michigan. Many growers counteract this lack with applications of manure and commercial fertilizers, reports R. Paul Larsen, Michigan State College horticulturist.

Larsen notes the strong inter-relationship between potassium, calcium and magnesium. When potassium is low, calcium and magnesium are usually high. This relationship may have some bearing on the deficiency of potassium.

**Less Legume Grass Seeds; Still Plenty**

Last year's drought and this year's diversion of land from wheat, cotton and corn are expected by U. S. Department of Agriculture observers to cause more spring seeding for pasture and hay crops.

The U. S. D. A. crop reporting board economists estimate grass and legume seed supplies will run 4 per cent ahead of last year's but supplies of alfalfa, red clover, alfalfa, ladino, smooth bromegrass are expected to be abundant. Sideline grass supplies are below average but 50 per cent ahead of last year.

**Put Large End Up Or Eggs Degrade**

Just how important it is to pack eggs with their large ends up was shown in recent tests by Michigan State College's poultry department.

The test started with eggs graded 50 per cent "AA" and 50 per cent "A." Nearly all of the eggs which were packed with large ends up were still "A" quality as determined by candling at the end of 14 days. But those packed with the small end up averaged a "B" quality.

The interior quality of eggs, which can be determined by candling, is an important factor in wholesale grading, the poultry men explain. To grade "A" or better, an egg must have a well-centered yolk. And the yolk has a tendency to rise in an egg packed with the small end up. This causes the egg to grade lower when it's candled. That means a lower price.

**Veal Market Could Save Dairy Income**

Michigan dairymen who may be worrying about the milk price drop might do well by taking advantage of a good veal market. And at the same time they'll be doing something about the milk surplus.

These three legumes are the best for supplying nitrogen, 100 pounds per acre, worth from \$10 to \$20. Legumes have to be inoculated and fertilized, Teas says, but they don't have to be in the soil for years. One year is enough to supply nitrogen and make the land easier to till.

**Henry's First**



As spring plowing gets underway on farms across the nation, none of the more than 4 million farm tractors in use will resemble this one. Henry Ford's first farm tractor, built in 1907, long since has been retired to a place of honor in the Henry Ford Museum, Dearborn, Mich. The 24-horsepower vehicle, which Mr. Ford called his "Automobile Five," sports an engine with copper water jackets. Its rear wheels were taken from a biplane. Despite its early vintage, it still runs.

**Legislature Faces Many Major Bills**  
With the Legislature fast approaching adjournment, many bills of vital importance have passed one chamber or the other and are awaiting final action.

Approved by the Senate and now before the House are bills which would increase unemployment compensation benefits to a maximum \$41 weekly for men with families and raise workmen's compensation payments for men who are injured in their jobs by 54 weeks.

Republican Senators pointed out that the new unemployment compensation scale is in line with President Eisenhower's recommendations that benefits should be one-half of take-home pay. Those objecting to the new scale were those which workers never receive in their pay checks, legislative leaders pointed out.

The new bill would also extend the duration of benefits from 26 weeks to 28 weeks and provides a merit rating system for employers whose contributions which would result in a tax reduction for thousands of businesses which maintain steady employment.

The Senate also has passed an industry control bill to strengthen the present law and compel the filing of expense data by lobbyists.

The House has approved and sent to the Senate legislation which would forbid the dramatization of beer drinking on television advertising and full control for a vote by the people on a constitutional convention to rewrite Michigan's 1893 Constitution.

Also approved by the House is a proposed constitutional amendment to modify sales tax levied by putting schools on a current basis and providing that schools shall receive the state's share of every three cents collected.

**State Accepts Four National 4-H Awards Programs For 1954**

The State Club office has accepted four national 4-H awards programs for participation of members in 1954, the National Committee on Boys and Girls Club Work has announced. The programs are Clothing Achievement, Garden, Poultry, and Tractor Maintenance. The last three of which awards have been changed.

In the 4-H Clothing program, four (formerly one) gold-filled medals of honor will be provided for winners in qualifying counties by the awards donor, Conis Clark, Inc. As in the past, the state winner will receive an all-expense trip to the National 4-H Club Congress in Chicago. Also 12 state winners selected for national awards will receive a \$300.00 college scholarship.

Instead of five sterling silver medals to county winners in the 4-H Tractor Maintenance program, four gold-filled medals will be provided this year by the Tractor and Implement Division, Ford Motor Co. Awards of an all-expense trip to the National 4-H Club Congress in Chicago for state winners, and \$300.00 college scholarships to 10 national winners remain unchanged.

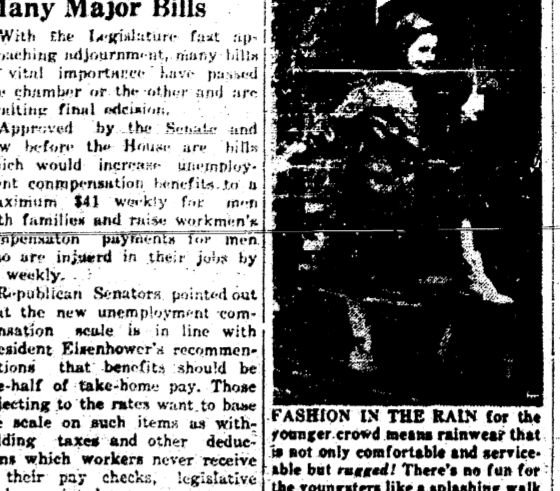
In the 4-H Garden Maintenance program, the Standard Oil Foundation, Inc. (Chicago) will provide four gold-filled medals of honor, an all-expense trip to the National 4-H Club Congress, and give \$300.00 college scholarships to county, state and national winners, respectively.

All these national 4-H programs are supervised by the Cooperative Extension Service.

In spite of the fact that the Michigan TB death rate has dropped to the lowest point in history, the number of new cases discovered each year has remained about the same during the past two decades.

The death rate has dropped from 213 per 100,000 population in 1921 to approximately 9 per 100,000 in 1953. During the same period, the number of new cases reported to the state health department has remained substantially the same—approximately 6,000 per year.

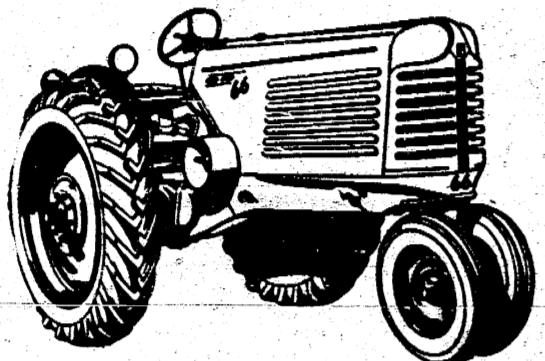
