

Then again while good surface drainage is important it does not in any respect substitute for loose, porous soil free from any ground water near the surface. It is of equal importance to have an adequate land area as well as suitable soil and drainage conditions where private sewage disposal is necessary.







Fans Take Heat Off Family ... Here's How Rooms Can Be Kept Cool

Farm Electrification Bureau In a vague sort of way most of us know why we feel cooler when the air rushes in through the open windows of our moving automobile on a hot idea. The outside temperature remains the some, but the breeze makes us fee: cooler. Why? Simply rate of evaporation of moisture from our skin. 



STOPPING A CHILD KILLER

By Science Features Whooping cough, called the number one child killer in North America by the UN's World Health Organization, can almost be eliminated. Between 1940 and 1948 it was responsible for three times as many deaths as nine other infant diseases combined, according to the WHO. But modern vaccine and drugs now give parents new hope.



Whooping cough, technically called pertussis, first masquerades as an ordinary cold, with running nose and eyes and a slight cough—at which time it is most contagious. Afterwards, as the coughing attacks develop, the child's attempts to breathe produce the characteristic whooping sound.

Antibiotic drugs are a useful weapon against this scourge. A recent report from the Bremen Pediatric Clinic in Germany said that "terramycin had an unequivocally beneficial effect." Complications were also reduced and 73 per cent of 85 whooping cough patients receiving the drug were "favorably influenced."

The best protection against whooping cough, according to most medical authorities, is obtained by vaccinating children when they are about six months old. A series of injections, often given with shots that prevent other serious diseases, usually make children immune for several years.


