ANN ARBOR — A varied schedule, featuring exhibits of industrial design, photography, painting, sculpture, textiles and prints, and drawings will be presented in 1954 at the University of Michigan's Museum of Art.

Announcement of the series, to be shown in the galleries on the second floor of the museum's building, was made by the museum's director, Prof. Jean Paul Sluozer.

Opening the fall art exhibit program will be "Design in Industry and Photography," both to run from September 13 through October 24.

The first, organized by the Museum of Modern Art, New York, is an exhibition of product design, graphic design, and architecture of the Divetti Company of New Italy.

The photographic exhibit includes approximately 150 works by well-known European photographers. It is assembled by the Director of the Department of Photography of the Museum of Modern Art, N.Y.

That's advice from Walter L. Hoffman, a bacteriologist at Michigan State College. He says that many such so-called "miraculous" products have appeared on the market from time to time.

The latest is a "highly concentrated mixture of enzymes." It is supposed to reduce "rot" or worm out bacteria, will not bacterial culture. It is supposed to speed up the reduction of solid waste matter for easier drainage.

In the first place, says Hoffman, the rotting of bacteria are in normal raw sewage. In the second place, he says, they don't become lost or worn out. They reproduce by dividing themselves. "I don't know of any substance on the market," he insists, "that will speed up the bacteria in doing their job."

The Board of Supervisors voted to transfer \$10,000 from the General Fund of the county to a special fund for a juvenile home. No increase in taxes is necessary since this is money already accumulated over the years.

The need for such a home is serious. 243 new cases of neglected and delinquent children were reported in Washington county in 1953; it is estimated that 1954 new cases will total 500. About 70 per cent of these cases should be handled by the county. The fact that there are no suitable quarters for the care of youngsters under 17 who are delinquent has long been sought by public and private groups in the county.

Foreign Investors Triple U. S. Holdings Since War Foreigners have been finding a gold mine in the U. S. since the war. The stream has gone west in this country. Value of their holdings here approaches \$4 billion dollars now, three times what it was before the war.

In addition, other nations and central banks have been building up their reserves—and in the process Uncle Sam's stock of gold has dropped by three billion dollars in the last five years.

But the Federal Reserve Board reports that the private demand for gold is now just about the same as the total of foreign holdings here.

Foreigners have 14 1/2 billion dollars here in liquid assets—that is, bank deposits and U. S. Treasury securities that they could quickly turn into cash. Less than two billion dollars of the total U. S. government and private investments abroad are in short-term liquid assets.

In all, foreigners have nearly \$10 billion invested in U. S. Treasury certificates, bank deposits, state, and local government securities.

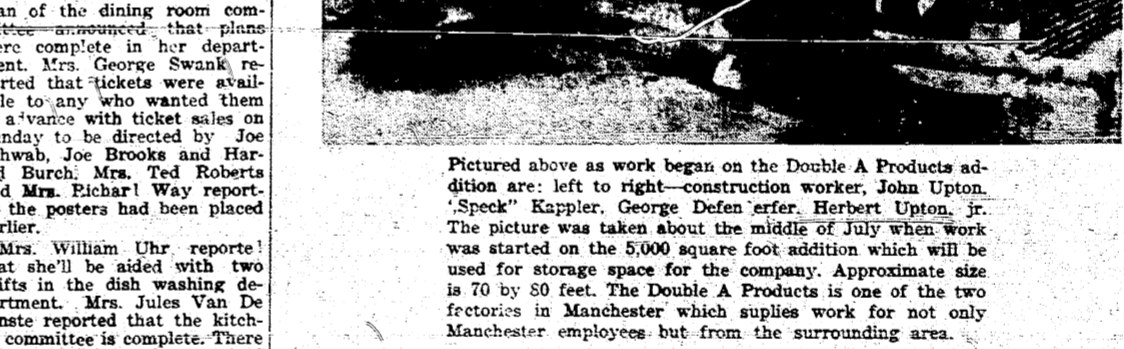

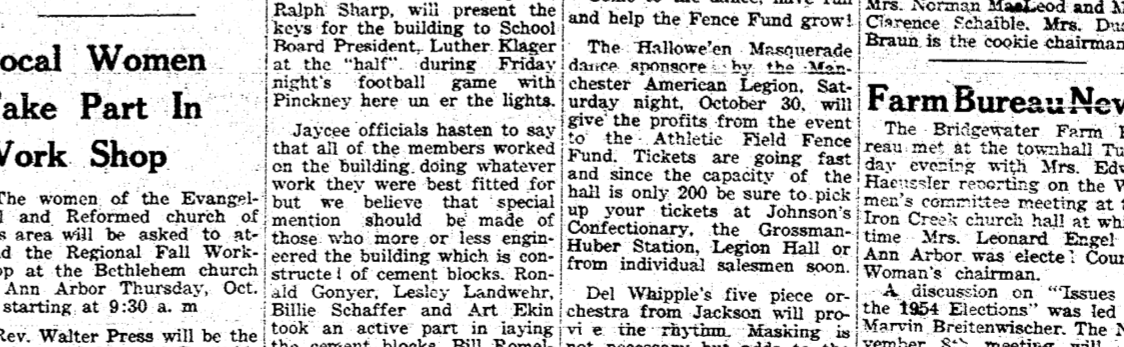

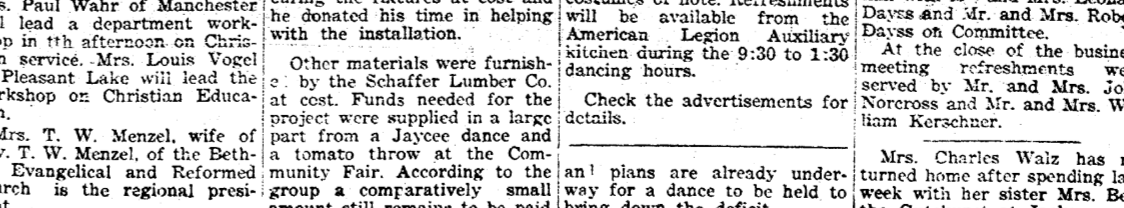
