

Chopped tomato pulp added to the tomato pulp through a sieve when the pulp settles over the food mill. Juice prepared in this way will not separate as much as a thinner variety of tomato. You will have less separation. Avoid adding water to the tomatoes, however, in all right to as you simmer them. Press all juice—just stir it up.

Now is the time for mailing Christmas packages to members of the armed services if they are to reach their destinations by December 25, according to postmaster Group Merriman. Packages for the armed services which go through New York and New Jersey and Central and South America must be mailed locally by Christmas.

Parcels for members of the service should be labeled "Gift Packages." Parcels for civilians should also carry the notation, "no express license required."

All packages are permitted to be marked "no express license required" in weight and length and with combined length and width combined.

Parcels for civilians can not exceed 14 pounds and 72 inches.

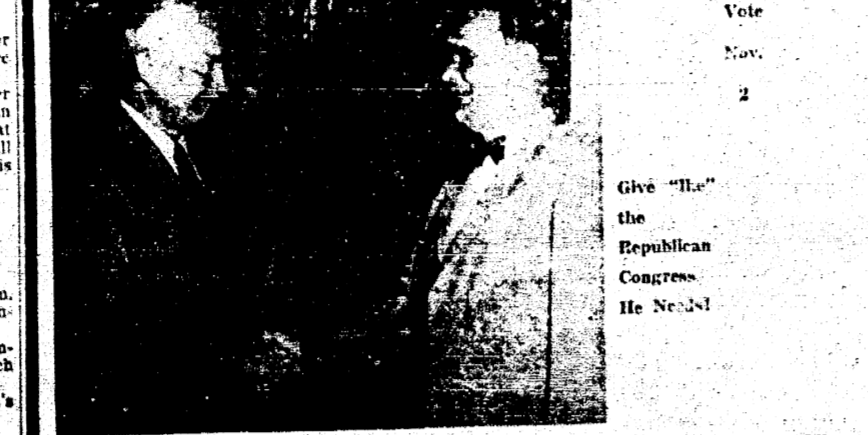

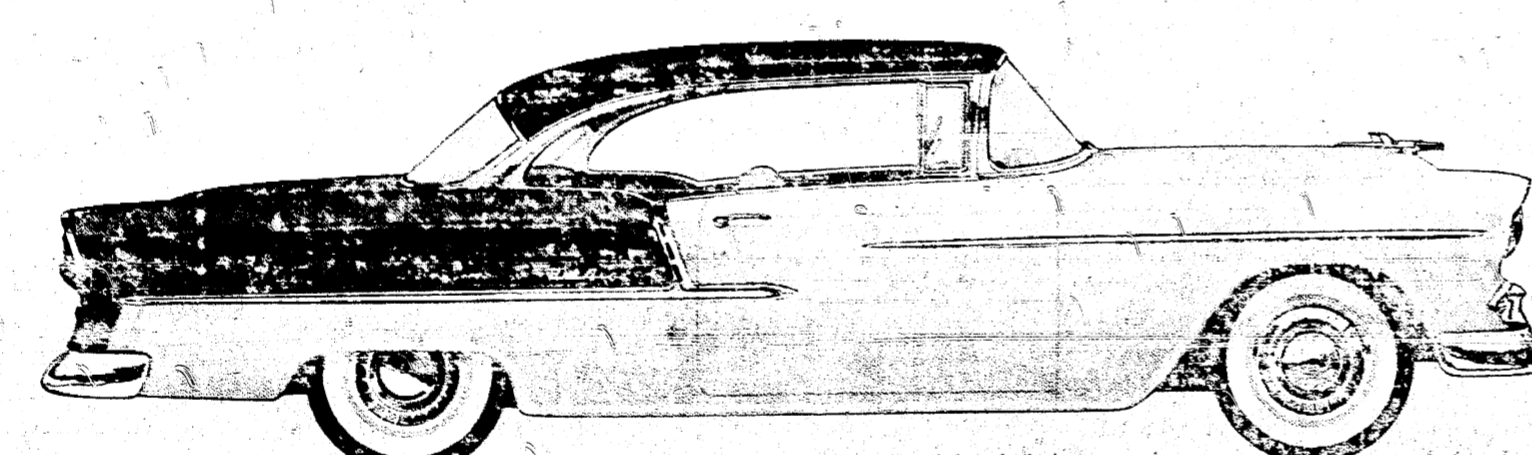
