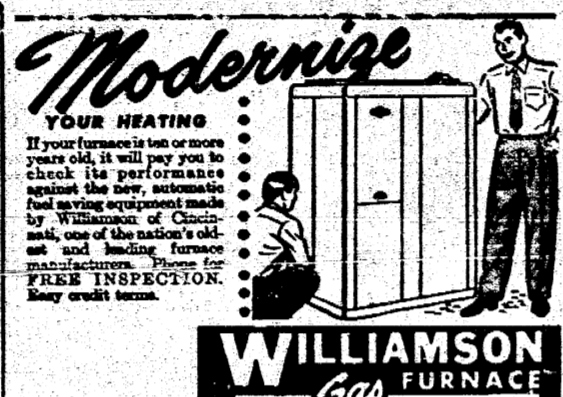

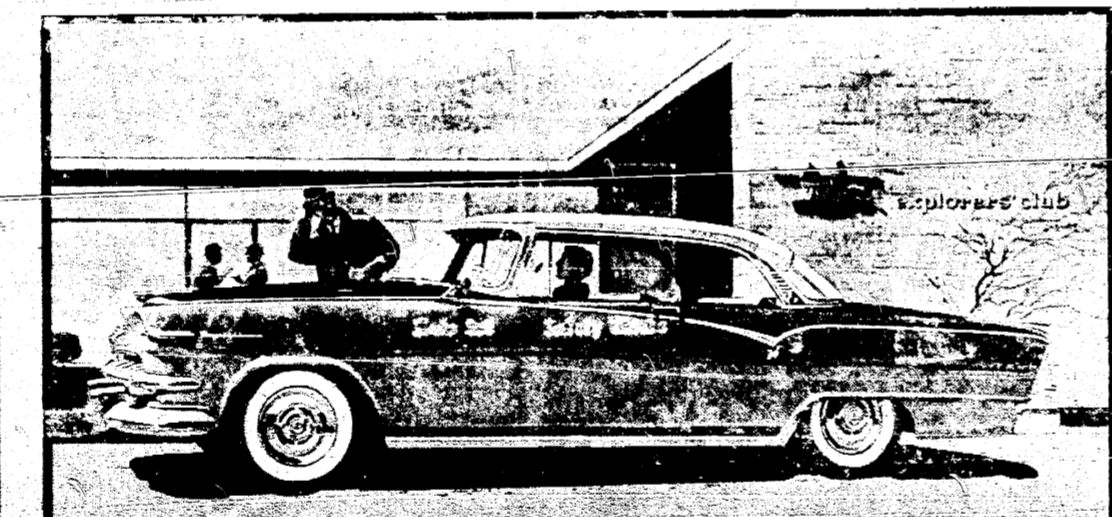

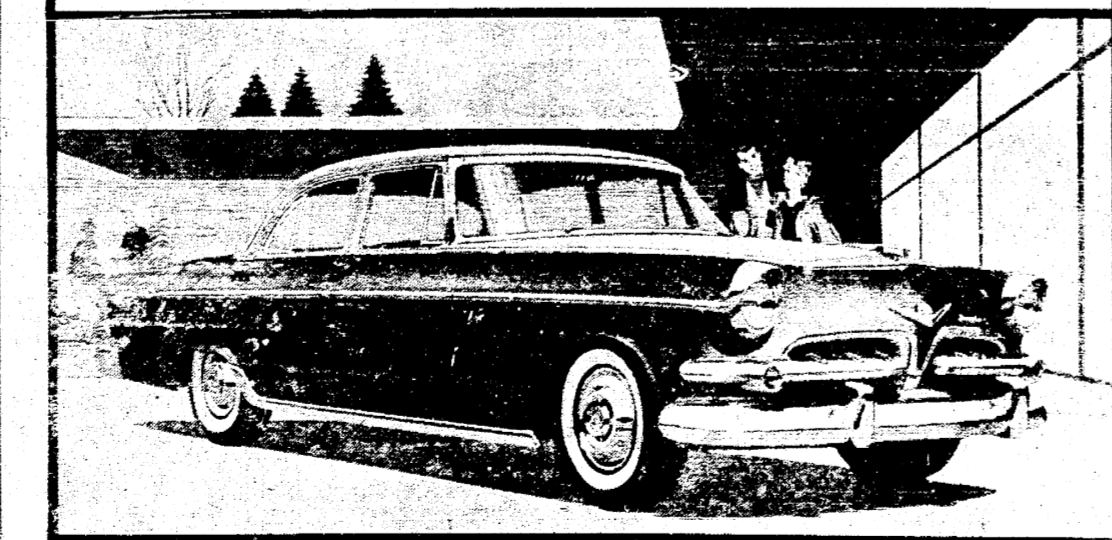

"No one waved a magic wand for the Fourth of July Labor Day," Mr. Dearborn said. "The good records came about because motorists generally re-

duced traffic accidents by their own actions, and to demonstrate that the community is the place to attack the traffic safety problem. An all-out national effort will be made to hold traffic accidents to a minimum.
