As an indication of the high credit standing enjoyed by the Manchester community, only 03 of one percent separated the highest bidder from the lowest. Associated with the first of Michigan Corporation in the winning bid were McDonald Moore & Co. and H. V. Sattley & Co. The interest rate to be paid by the school district's taxpayers is 1.304 percent less than the 3.5 percent figured in the bond prospectus.
