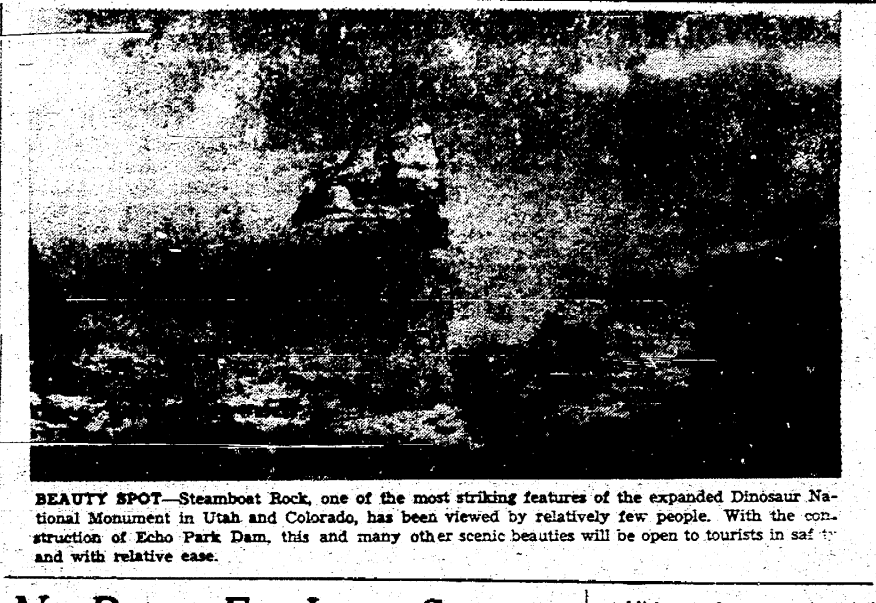

Postmaster General Arthur E. Summerfield has announced that this special three-cent stamp commemorating the centennial of Michigan State College and Pennsylvania State University will go on sale in East Lansing, Mich., on Feb. 12, exactly 100 years after the governor signed the legislative act establishing Michigan Agricultural College. The first such college in the nation, M.A.C.—now M.S.C.—became the model for the land-grant colleges set up under the Morrill Act of 1862. Pennsylvania State University established a farmers' high school in 1855 and it was made the Agricultural College of Pennsylvania one month before the Morrill Act was passed. The Centennial stamp is only the third in the history of U. S. Commemorative stamps honoring a college or university.
