#### Set To Fan Up Grain Profit Again

A pioneer in the new method of crop handling, George Wilson of Buffalo, Ill., gets ready to again start up the fan that has blown profit-making air into each of his corn crops since 1948. Wilson began using unheated forced air to dry early-planted, moist ear corn which he bought one of the first Quonset equipped with this system five years ago. He figures the installation has paid for the building several times over by conditioning the grain and keeping it in good condition until the after-harvest price rise. Wilson now uses another Quonset drying and storage unit for wheat.

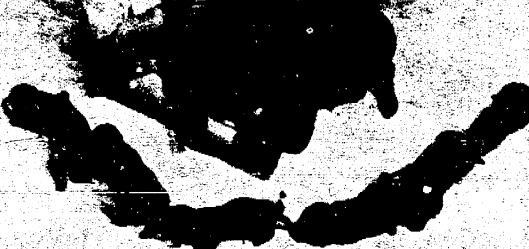

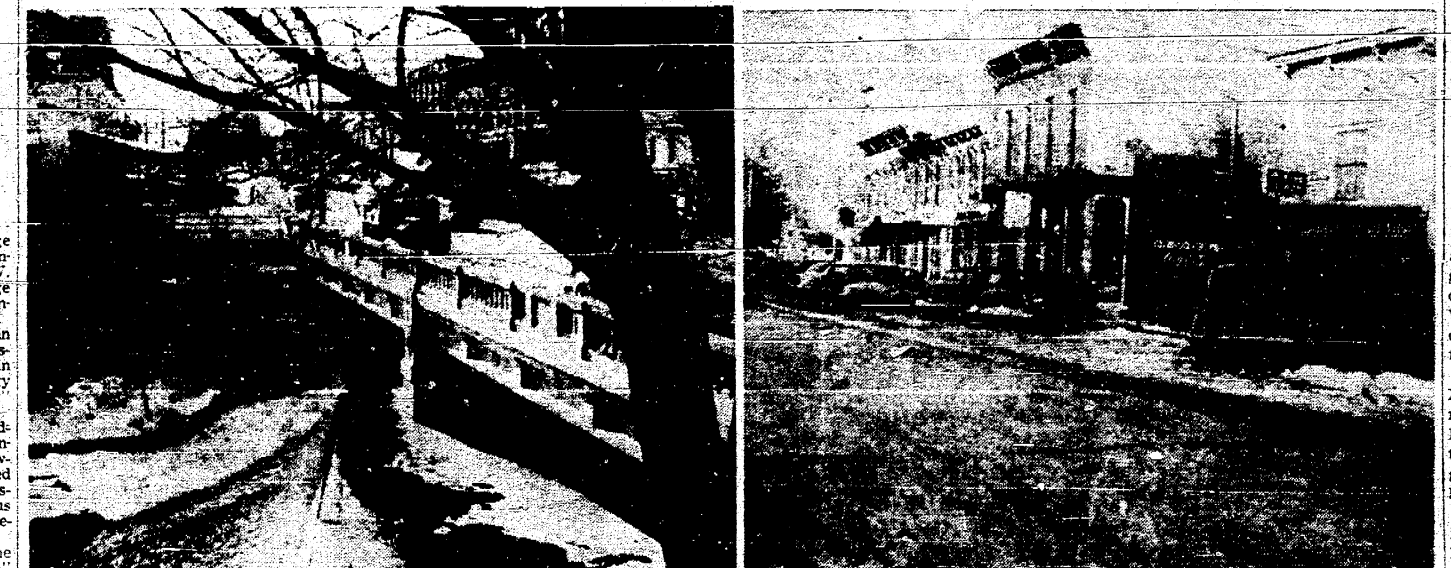
