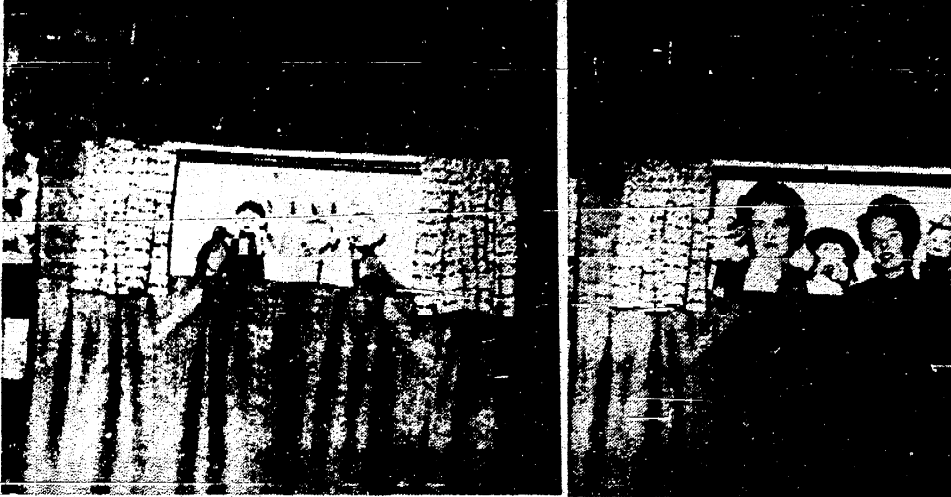

Manchester's immunization clinic has been set up for Thursday, March 31 at 9 a. m. at the local school, according to Dr. Otto R. Engleke, health officer of Washtenaw County, who has released the schedule for immunization clinics sponsored by the Washtenaw County Medical Society each year.

These clinics will be held all over the County and will offer immunizations for whooping cough, diphtheria and tetanus. There will also be vaccinations for smallpox given at the clinics. The child under five years of age will get a triple toxoid which protects him from whooping cough, diphtheria and tetanus or lockjaw, while children over five will be given doses to prevent diphtheria and tetanus. Dr. Engleke said.

Signed request slips must be returned to the schools in order for planning to be completed. Those children not in school may be brought to clinics and request slips signed there, Dr. Engleke pointed out.

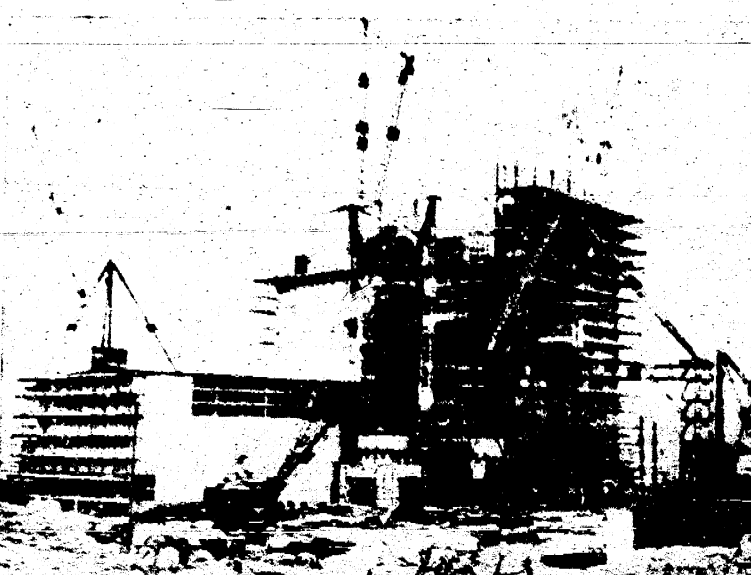

Business Practices Now in Use Soon Might be Obsolete

By SAM DAWSON
Business practices now considered advanced might become obsolete overnight if Americans put to use the techniques scientists already know or can develop.
A leading scientist, Dr. Vannevar Bush, president of the Carnegie Institution of Washington, says so. And he thinks this should be done right about now, because before the present "heat and evolve" process of information gets too big to be used efficiently.
"Take the telephone," Dr. Bush thinks businessmen will use it more and more. But the telephone is often a nuisance, breaking in on other work. Outlining his views to members of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers meeting here, Dr. Bush suggests they perfect a way "by which conversations could be carried on when both participants rather than just one, want to talk and find it convenient to do so."
As for the stenographer on whom most businessmen rely, the scientist says: "We could make a machine that would type when we talked into it."
Dr. Bush finds the postal system, with multiple handling of a letter between sender and recipient, "utterly archaic." He says, "It is quite possible to read addresses photographically, if they are in proper code and to render all sorting automatic."
But Dr. Bush thinks the most pressing need now is to work out
