

Harold Geyer Dies; Native Of Freedom

Funeral services were held last week for Harold H. Geyer, 57, a lifelong resident of the Ann Arbor area, who died Monday morning following a heart attack at his home in Ann Arbor. He was active in the automotive industry for 28 years.

Born Nov. 9, 1897, at Rogers Corners, Freedom Township, he was a son of Lewis A. and Fredericka Ruth Geyer.

On April 28, 1926, he was married to the former Rena O. Feldkamp, who survives. He was a member of the Bethel Church, Evangelical and Reformed Church, of Ann Arbor.

Mr. Geyer was employed at the Ann Arbor Buick Service Co. from 1924 to 1942, serving as sales manager of that firm for 14 years. During the war, he was with the Ford Motor Co. administrative department, first at the River Rouge plant and later at the Willow Run Remocon Plant.

He joined the Ann Arbor Moror Sales and Service, Inc., Cadillac agency, as sales manager in 1942.

Easy to Make Pork Sausage, Says MSC Man

EAST LANSING—Know the best way to make your own pork sausage?

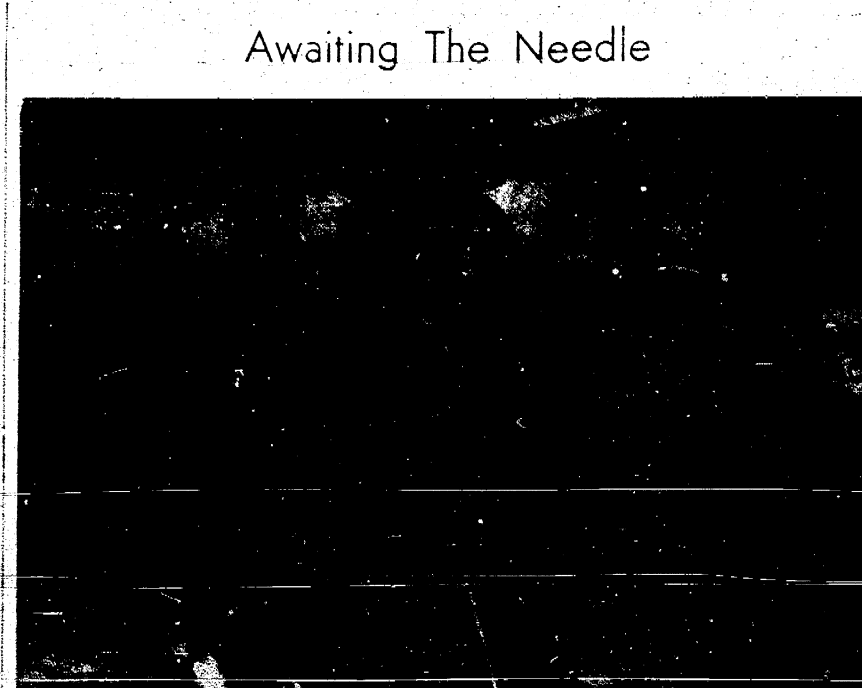
Lyman Brantler, a Michigan State College meats specialist, offers this advice.

Use three-fourths lean meat to one-fourth fat. Cut the trimmings into one-inch cubes, then weigh the result. For each 25 pounds add these ingredients:

Nine tablespoons of salt, four tablespoons of black pepper, two tablespoons of ground sage and one tablespoon of ground nutmeg, or cloves or any of the spice your family likes. But mix it well with the one-inch cubes of pork trimmings.

Then you're ready to put the seasoned meat through the grinder. Don't hold the sausage more than four to six weeks in the freezer food locker. Mr. Brantler advises. The salt makes sausage rancid after that long.

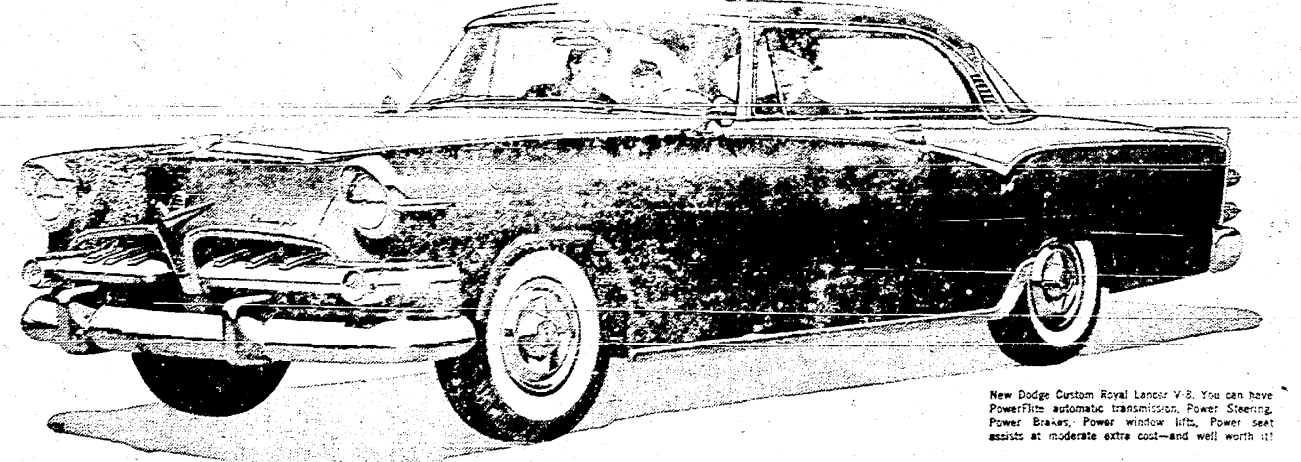

Dictatorship Over, Syria Has World's Most Active Left Wing

A year ago Syria was ridding itself of a rightist military dictatorship. Today this country has the most active left wing in the Arab world and is a potential trouble spot.

Syria is the only Arab state to elect an admitted Communist to Parliament. A third of its newspapers are leftist. And Syrian Communist leaders have emerged as leaders of all Arab Reds.

Communists here got their big chance in March 1954 after military dictator Adib Shishkly was overthrown. Shishkly had suppressed communism with a heavy hand. He also had suppressed all other parties. Accustomed to working underground, the Communists weathered the dictatorship in better form than more conservative parties with no underground apparatus.

Communists still are a small minority in Syria, but their influence is strong internally and externally. The party officially is outlawed, but its candidates enter elections as independents, and its leaders are well known.

In last September's parliamentary elections, Communist elected party leader Khalid Bekdash to the Syrian Parliament. Communist running as independents polled a relatively heavy vote in Damascus. Throughout the country, the total Communist vote was around 45,000 in a population of about 2 1/2 million.

All these 45,000 are not Communists, of course. Many voted for the left simply in protest against the West. Others supported Communists in exchange for leftist support of their own candidates.

Although their number is not large, the Communists have gained disproportionate influence through manipulating an informal "popular front" with the Socialist, Reconstruction party and the Moslem Brotherhood. These three can pull together potent mob strength for widespread demonstrations at almost any time.

Dr. Milton Eisenhower, in a speech to the Inter-American conference on investments, "Good relations between the United States and the nations of Latin America are imperative as we seek to build a cooperative peace characterized by freedom and rising levels of well-being."

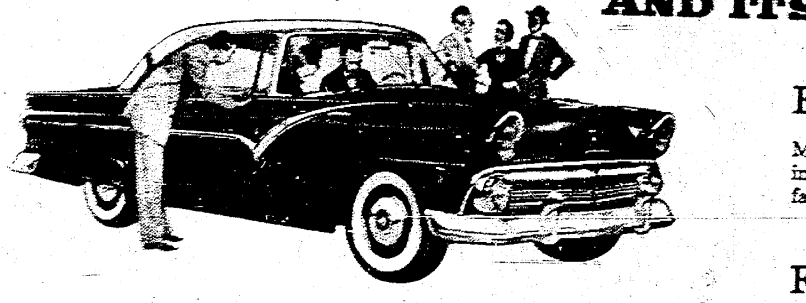
