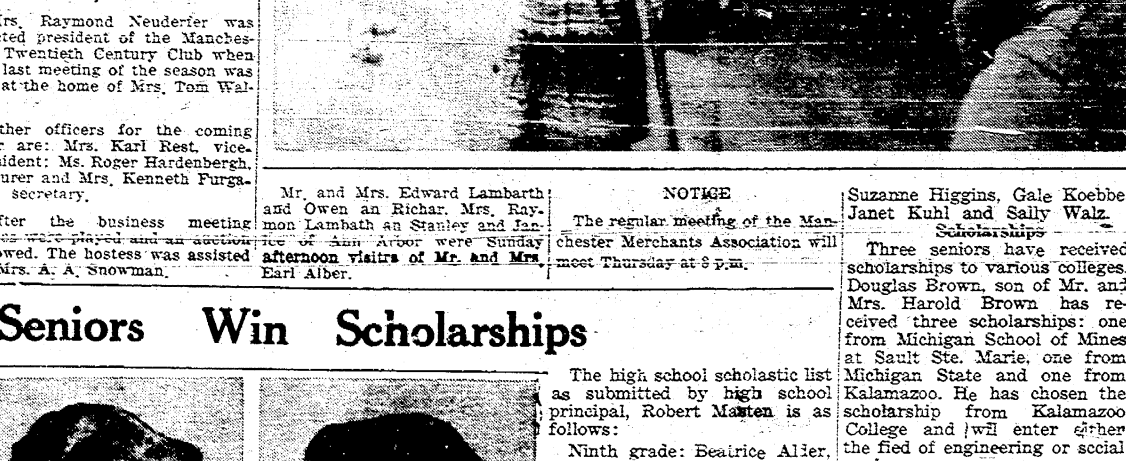

Hospitalized

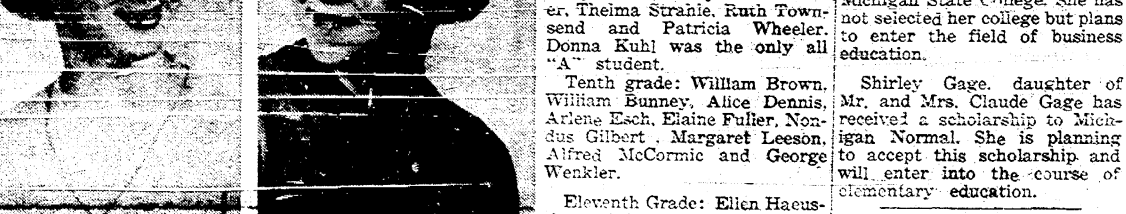
