### Don't Be A Mixup Mixer

If you've had your hand on the bottle keep your foot off the throttle.

That warning that reads the motorists' drivers today by the National Safety Council as it opened its annual Christmas safety campaign.

The campaign is aimed at reducing both by accidents. Special emphasis will be on traffic accidents, which have taken an upward swing this year of about 5 percent. A contributing factor to this increase is an ever greater part in motor vehicle travel.

Motorists are told that the festive spirit of the Christmas season always adds to the normal winter hazards of bad weather, slippery roads and added hours of darkness, the Council said.

In warning against driving after drinking, the Council said that one-fourth of all fatal traffic accidents above a drinking driver or pedestrian. The normality of the holiday probably increases this percentage.

In an effort to reduce traffic accidents to a minimum, the Council urged motorists to observe the Council's suggestions for the prevention of driver fatigue, the Council said.

"If everyone would be the driver's proper and assume personal responsibility for himself and others, whether walking or driving, many holiday traffic accidents could be prevented," said the Council.

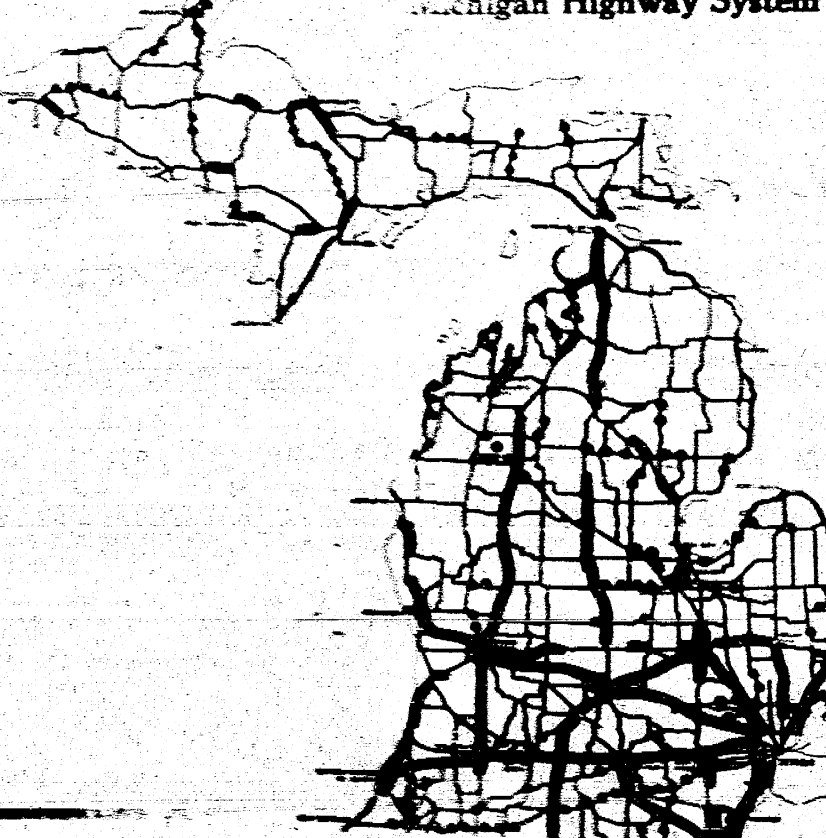

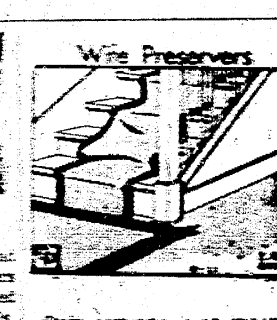

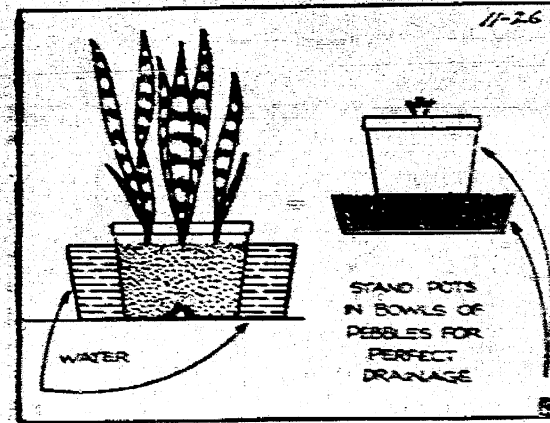

### Keeping House Plants Healthy

It is said that most house plants are killed because of improper watering. In fact, most plants die because of too much water. The amount of water to give a plant depends on the type of soil, the type of plant, the season of the year, and the humidity of the air. In winter, plants need less water because they are dormant. In summer, they need more water because they are growing. Always check the soil before watering. If it is dry to the depth of an inch, then water. If it is still damp, wait another day. Overwatering can lead to root rot and other diseases. Use a peat-based potting soil for indoor plants. It holds moisture and provides nutrients. Avoid fertilizing too often, as this can burn the roots. Prune dead leaves and stems to keep the plant healthy and attractive. If you have any questions about house plants, consult a professional gardener.

### Automatic Devices Adding Fuel to Rift Between Big, Small Farmers

Rapid mechanization of agriculture—spurred by huge war and postwar demands—is pouring fuel on a long smoldering rift between "small" and "big" farmers. Declining prices of farm products are farming the feed. Recent hearings on farm problems held by the Senate Agriculture Committee in major farming areas indicated this rift may become a major issue—along with farm price supports—in next year's presidential campaign. Machinery, electrification, better seeds, improved fertilizers and the like are making it possible to grow more and more crops on fewer and fewer acres. Likewise, new feeds open the way to produce more meats, eggs and poultry with less feed and labor. This increased efficiency is putting a squeeze on the smaller farmers who do not have the finances to take advantage of improved mechanization or enough land to justify their use. Largely because of mechanization, crop surpluses have been built up. Prices have been depressed. Naturally, the less efficient producers are hit hardest—and they are, in most cases, operators of smaller farms. This development has given rise to new demands that government farm policies be designed to protect the "family-type" farmer. Government reports show there has been a rather sharp decline in the total number of farms in the last 20 years. It has been estimated by an increase in the average size of farms. The farmers belonging to the forefront demands of some farmers are making it clear that agriculture is not just a way of life; that as a business, farms have become targets of mechanization and specialization; that there is no virtue in making small farm operators any more than in making small business men; that small farm operators must be dealt with as a business, and not as a farm problem. "The situation confronting agriculture is being faced by the farmer who would not foist upon the farmer farm program which will, through economic pressure, place the farmer into the employ of giant corporations," said the committee in its report. "The farmer who competes in the labor pool as an unskilled worker, he said. Similarly, a Larry Nelson, manager of the Washington State Grange, said the question that should be uppermost in the minds of all is "Do we want to maintain the American standard of living on every type and size of farm in the nation?" "I think that we do," he said. "Those who want farming considered solely as a business generally favored the flexible price support program of the Eisenhower administration farm program and minimum of government regulation."
