## Tax Relief Seen For '56 Presidential Year

Some form of tax relief seems inevitable in 1956, a presidential election year. Yet a good deal of political jockeying can be expected before the final answer is given. President Eisenhower's Economic Report of 1955 held out to Congress the prospect of "a general, though moderate reduction in tax rates, subject to some adjustment. Also, it wanted an overall tax revision, to cut out Treasury revenues by \$4.4 billion. Congress voted the postponement of the corporation income tax cut and the excise tax rate reduction, although the excise rate "adjustment" was considerably greater than contemplated by the administration. A Democratic proposal to raise the income tax exemption as part of the tax revision bill was defeated only after the President took to the air Mar. 15 to tell the citizens that this move would "strike a serious blow to the economy." The revision measure eventually was approved substantially as desired, although the Democrats succeeded in shaving the amount of the income tax relief. The administration wanted the 52 per cent rate of the corporation income tax rate continued for another year. Congress approved the corporation rate extension and the Senate-House Committee on the Economic Report, which is considering the bill, on Nov. 25 said that it would be glad to see Congress take such action. But Douglas at least a budget-balancer, insisted that there should be no net reduction. Treasury experts have estimated that an increase of only \$100 million in the income tax revenues would reduce revenues by about \$2.5 billion. ### Rabies Clinics Extension Planned

Concurrent with an announcement that dog licensing regulations would be more strictly enforced, comes an announcement from Dr. Otto K. Engleke, Washtenaw County Health Officer, of plans being made to extend coverage of the rabies vaccination clinics sponsored by the Health Department.

Representatives of the Dog Control Committee of the Board of Supervisors, the Washtenaw County Veterinary Medical Association, and the Health Department made plans for the clinics to be held in January 1956. It was decided at the meeting that hours would be changed and several clinic locations, and an itinerant program of publicity would be undertaken.

Attending the meeting as representatives of the Board of Supervisors, Dog Control Commission were Mr. Freeman Weber of Whitcomb Lake, Mr. Edworth Leighton, Saline, and Mr. Manuel Hoffman of Chelsea. Drs. Harvey Shuman and Paul Hovey of Ann Arbor, Dr. W. C. Lane, Chelera, Dr. Richard W. Hinkley of Ypsilanti, and Dr. Otto K. Engleke and George Bowler from the Health Department. Dr. George Bowler is lecturer of Manchester.

### Christmas Card Hints

Helpful hints for mailing Christmas cards are offered by Postmaster George Murrain as follows:

1. BOTH RETURN address and recipient's address should be plainly written. Zone numbers should be included, where applicable.
2. STAMP MUST be firmly affixed in the upper right hand corner. Every year cards are returned to the sender or end up in the dead letter office when stamps fall off before they reach the postoffice.
3. CHRISTMAS CARDS addressed to out of town points should be mailed not later than Dec. 15 or sooner to more distant points; those for local delivery should be mailed by December 17.
4. TO SPEED delivery, post your cards and tie them in two separate rate bundles, with the addresses facing one way. Labels should then be attached indicating "AIR MAIL DELIVERY" and "AIR MAIL DELIVERY". These labels may be obtained free at all post offices.
5. CHRISTMAS CARDS a 3-cent stamp are first class. They are mailed and delivered first and will be forwarded or returned if no stamp is on the envelope.

Only 3-cent Christmas cards costing 2 or 6 cent airmail stamps may include a personal message. Nothing more than a signature is authorized on cards mailed at the 2 cent rate. They may be sent in two and three fourths by four inches.

The clinics previously have been held at 43 locations all over the county to facilitate the vaccination of dogs. At these clinics members of the Veterinary Medical Association give vaccination for dogs at a reduced rate of \$1.50. Representatives of the Township Clerk's office will be on hand to enable owners to purchase a license at the time of the vaccination.

A regulation passed in 1948 by the Washtenaw County Board of Supervisors requires that all applications for a dog license shall be accompanied by proof that the dog has been vaccinated within the preceding year.

According to Dr. Engleke, this regulation and the vaccination clinics have been responsible for the amazing decrease of cases of rabies in Washtenaw County. Since the passage of the regulation and the establishment of the clinics, less than a dozen native animals have been found to be rabid. Dr. Engleke concluded.

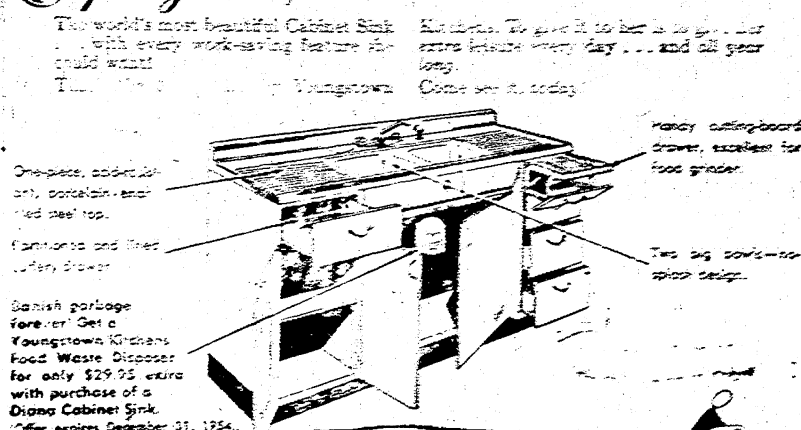

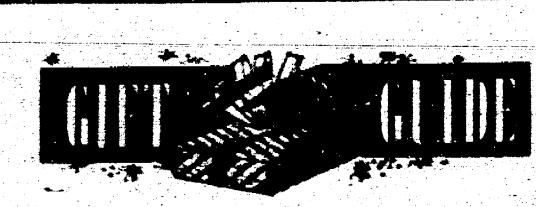

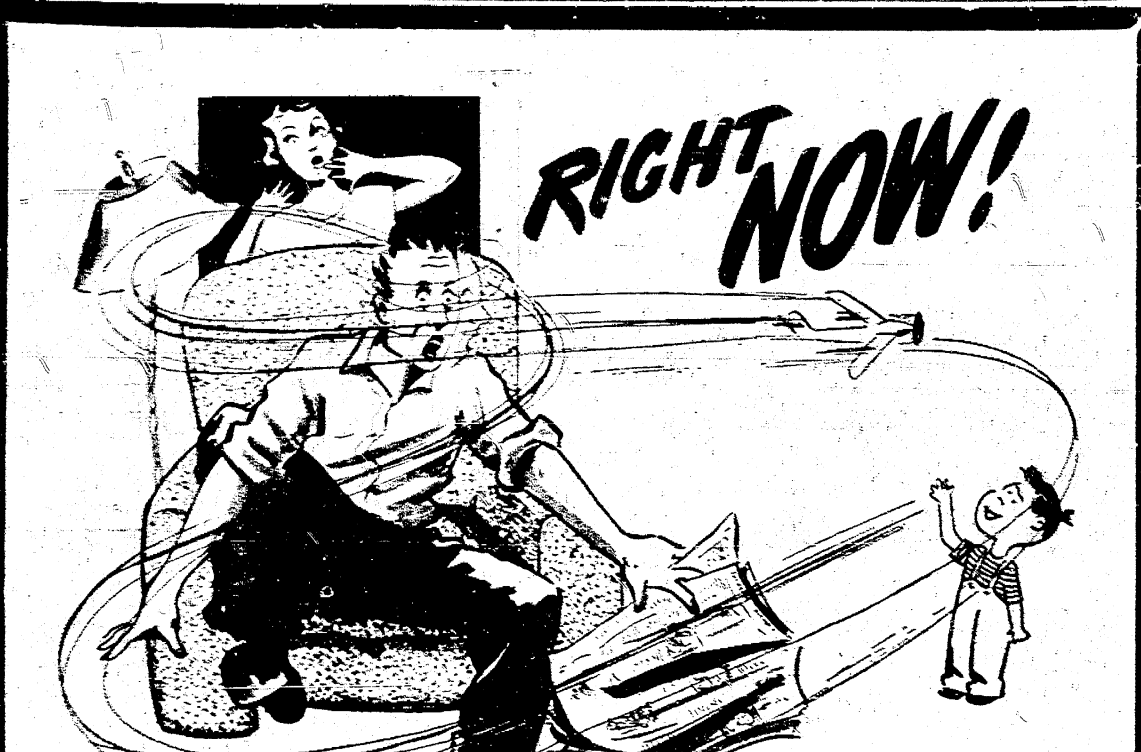
