higher learning in America had been a privileged experience for the relative few. Gaining in stature, strength and ability, Michigan State College grew with the times, in 1870 the first woman student was enrolled. Research became increasingly important; M.S.C. professors ushered in hybrid corn, imported the first sugar beets into Michigan and fought farm insects with chemicals.

The 1880's saw establishment of the college's famous agricultural extension service and experimental station. Michigan State's enrollment is 15 times greater than 50 years ago and 128 different courses are taught in its classrooms. One belle, however, has remained unchanged through the century. In the words of M.S.C.'s 12th president, Dr. John A. Hannah, Michigan State still believes today that knowledge "must not be worshipped for itself, as a god, but put to work for the good of mankind."
