Pineapple Sponge Cake
1 cup sifted Swiss Meringue Butter
4 eggs, 1 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup sugar, 1 cup hot pineapple juice, or other strained canned pineapple, 2 teaspoons double-acting baking powder, 1 teaspoon vanilla.

Sift flour, cocoa, meringue and salt again. Beat eggs and salt together until very thick and light colored—about 1 to 1 1/2 minutes. Then add sugar gradually, beating constantly. Add 1/2 cup of the flour, alternating with the hot pineapple juice, beating well after each addition. Combine remaining flour and baking powder in a separate bowl and add to the mixture in three additions, beating well after each addition. Bake in a 9x12 inch pan at 350 degrees for 25 minutes.

It's Fun to Make Mistakes on Purpose
March evenings seem to us to be the ideal time for trying something new and different, for experimenting and finding new interests. And today we've got a suggestion to pass along—trick photography.

First of all, you have to put your camera on a tripod or other solid support, because there have to be time exposures. Camera movement would spoil the trick in this case.

To take a picture like the one we used to illustrate today's column, set up your table where you can have a plain dark background. One way to achieve this is to put it in front of a door which is opened into a dark room. Place your subject in the first position. Snap the picture. Then, without winding the film, move her to the next position and snap another picture, and so on. If you want her in the picture a third time, be careful not to move the table. It has to be in the same position for each exposure.

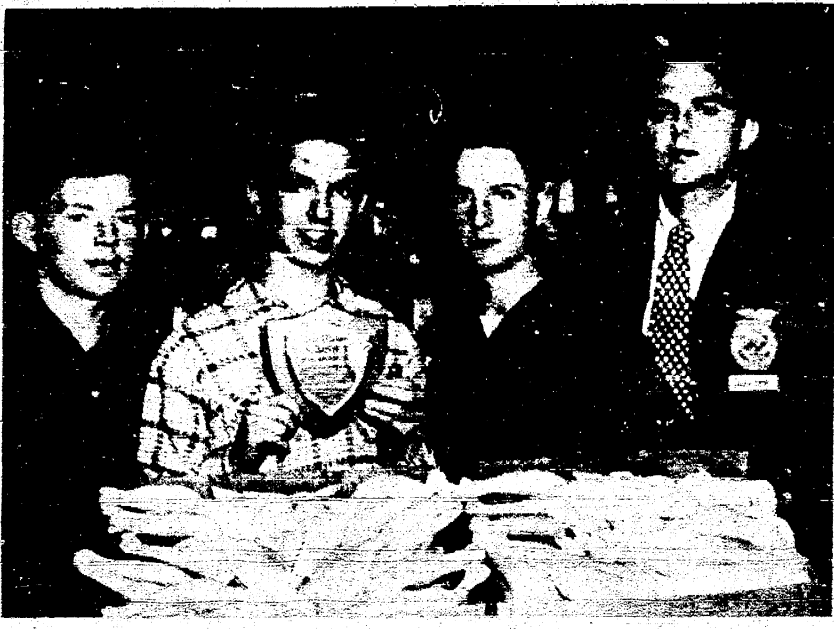

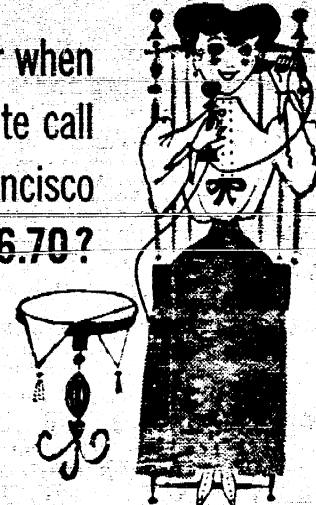

Two women at the conservation department's forest fire experiment station near Roscommon finish overhauling a fire-plow in preparation for the coming forest fire season.

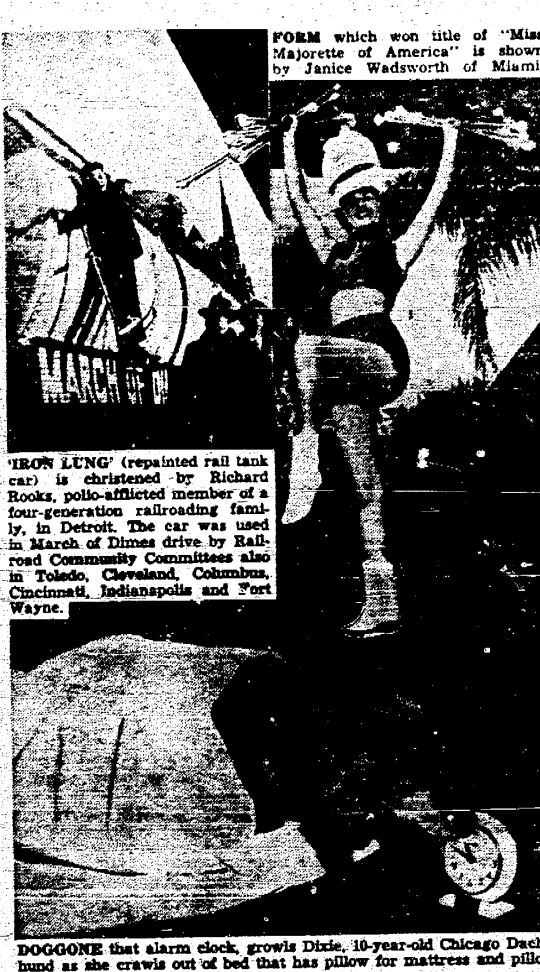

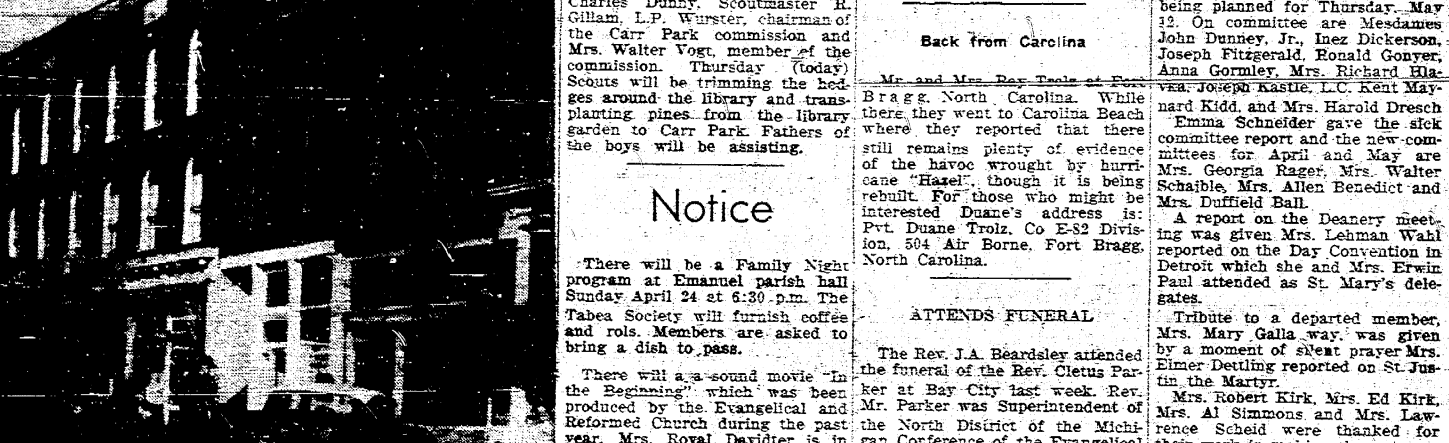
