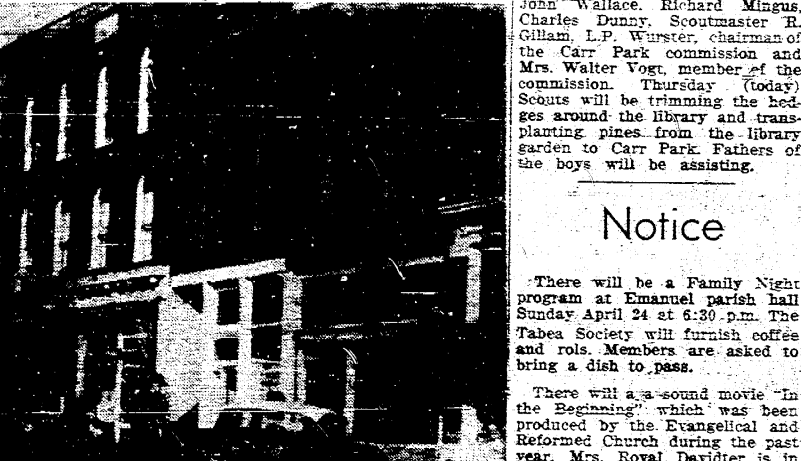
Hospital Aux. To Hold Spring Meet

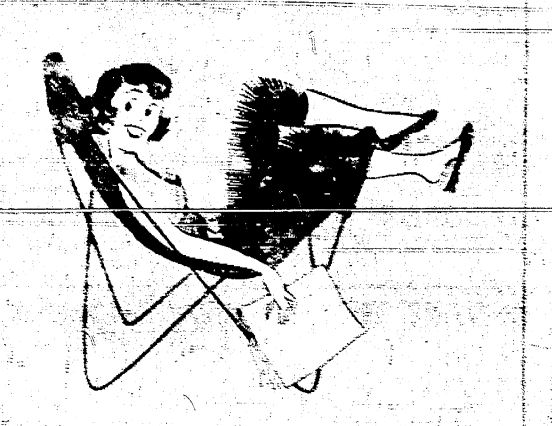

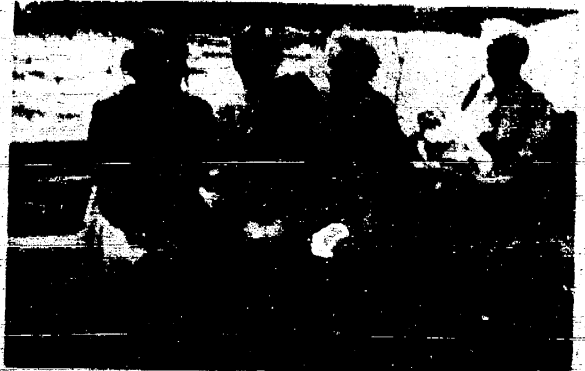
